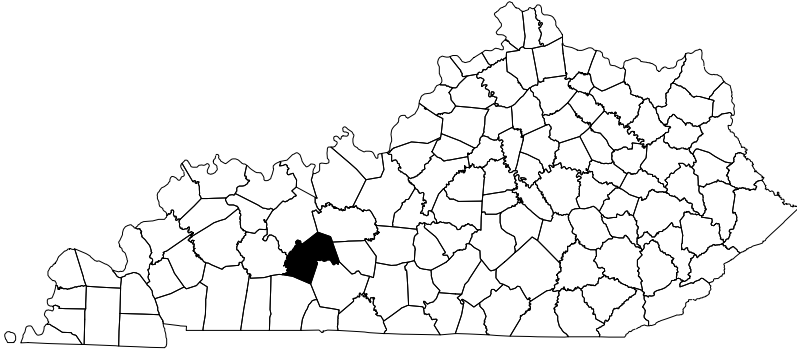

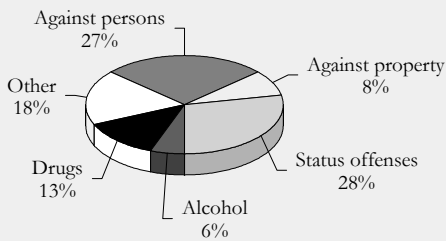
\* 12% of high school graduates went to vocational/technical school, second highest in the state.

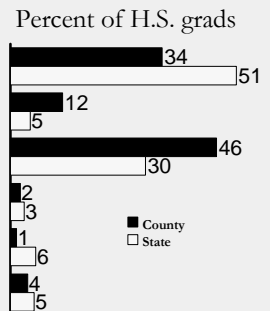
