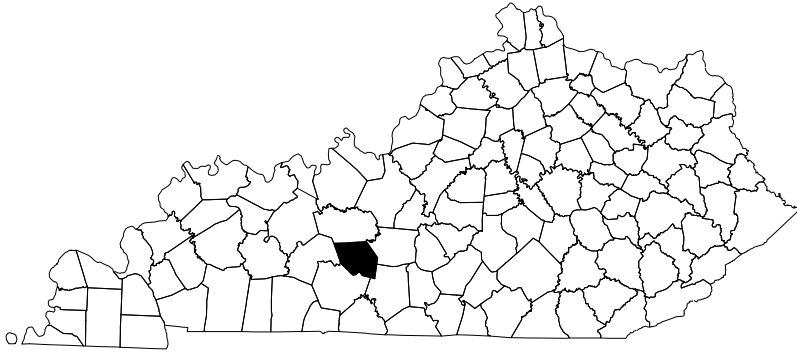

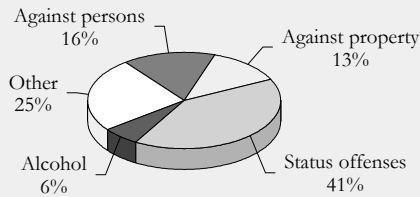
\* High school graduates were much more likely to work than go to college.
