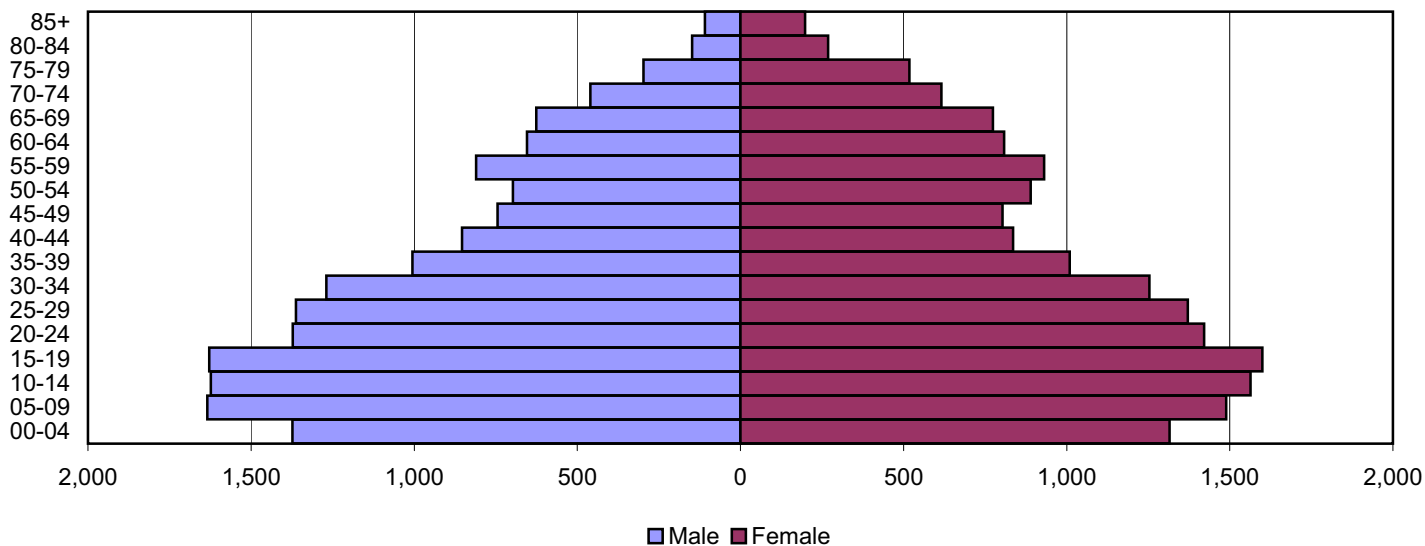

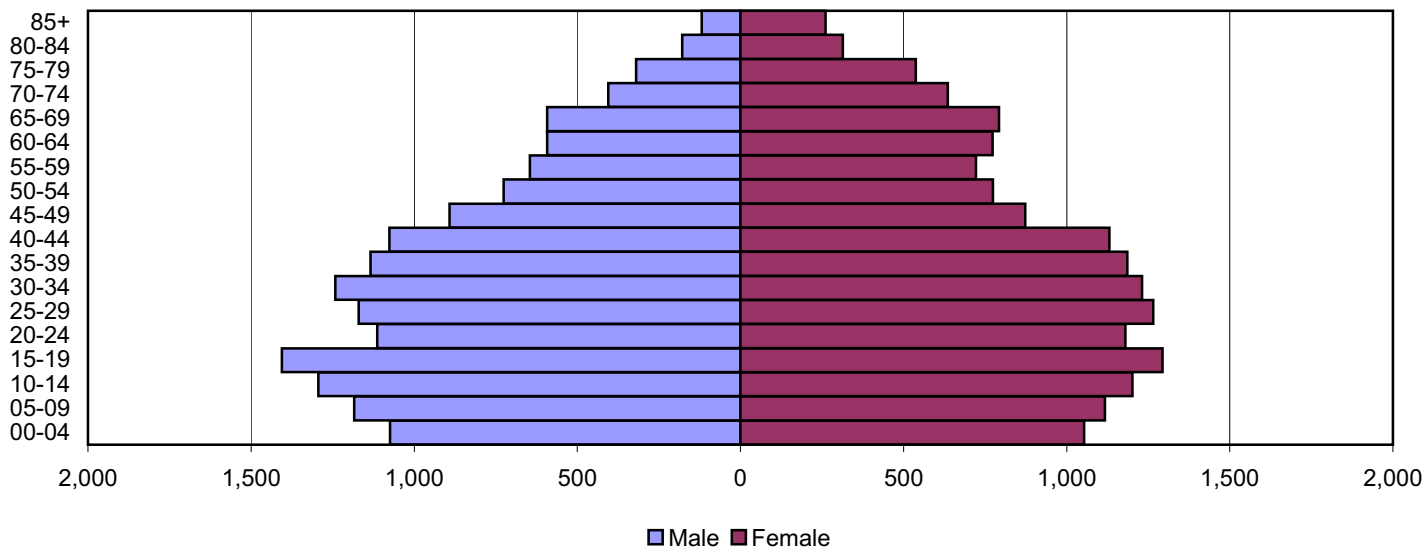
- (1) The United States is experiencing a major demographic revolution.**

Bell County Population Pyramids

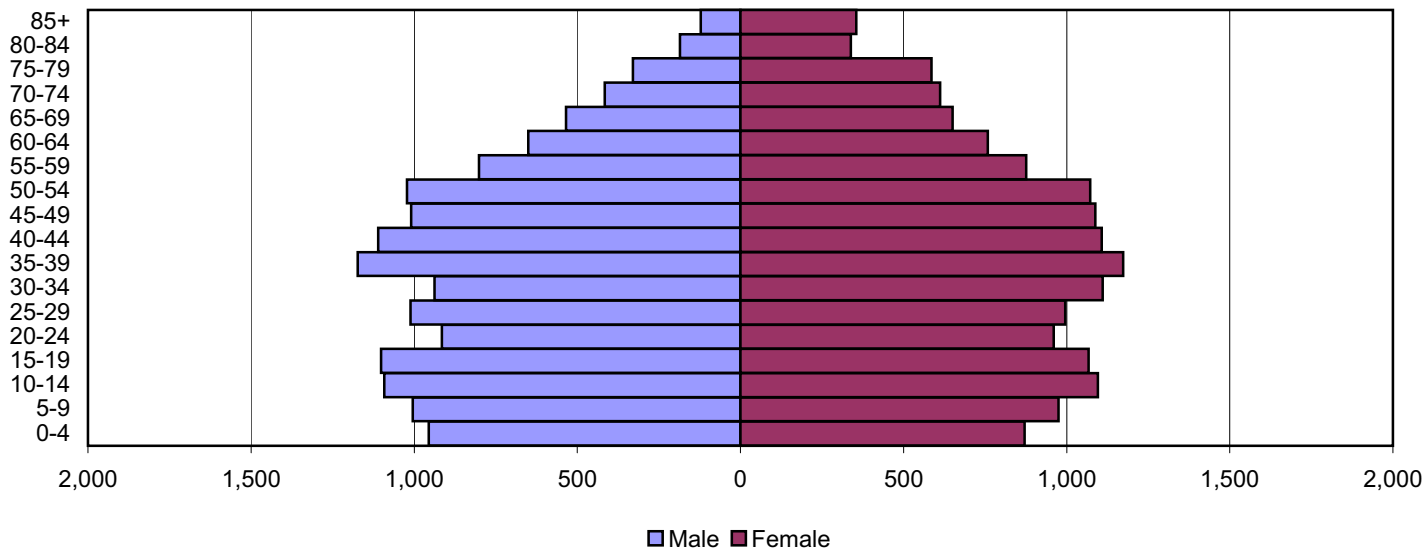

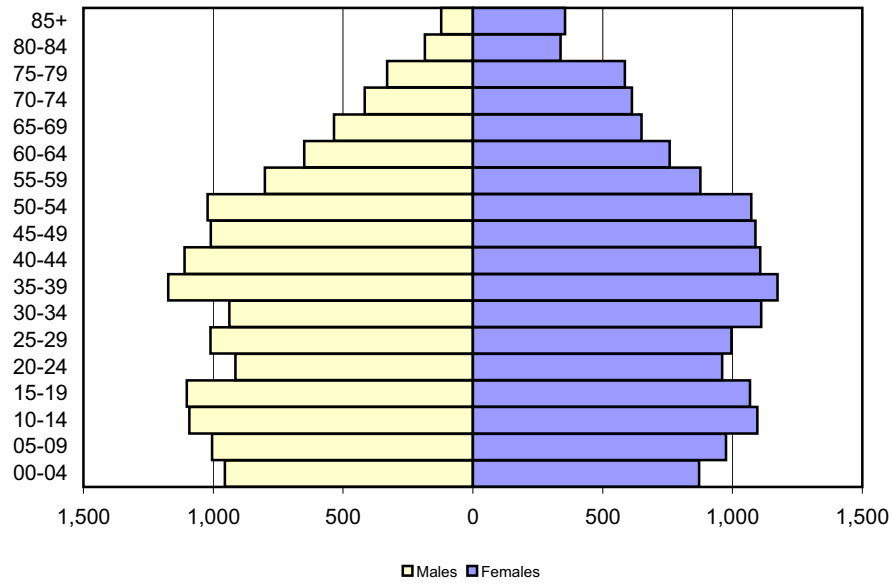

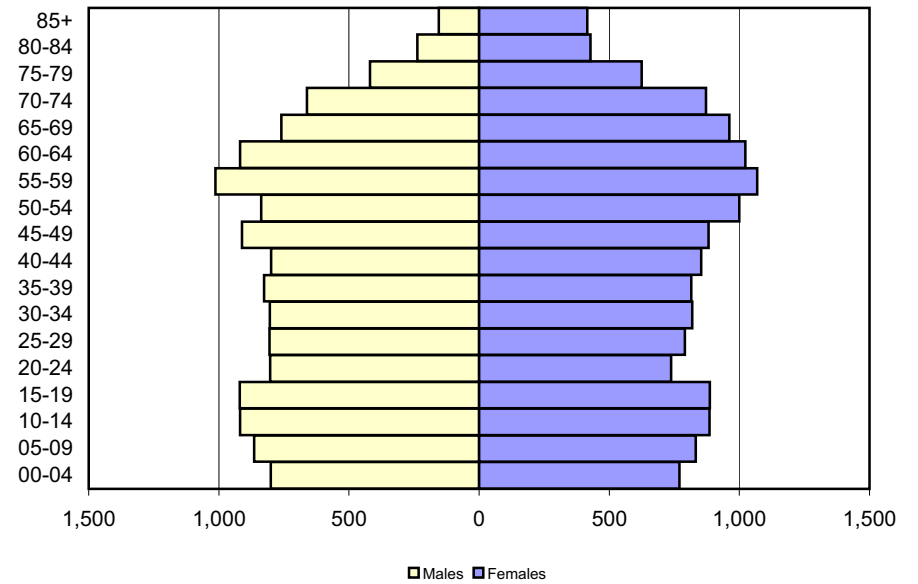

Bell County Population Pyramids

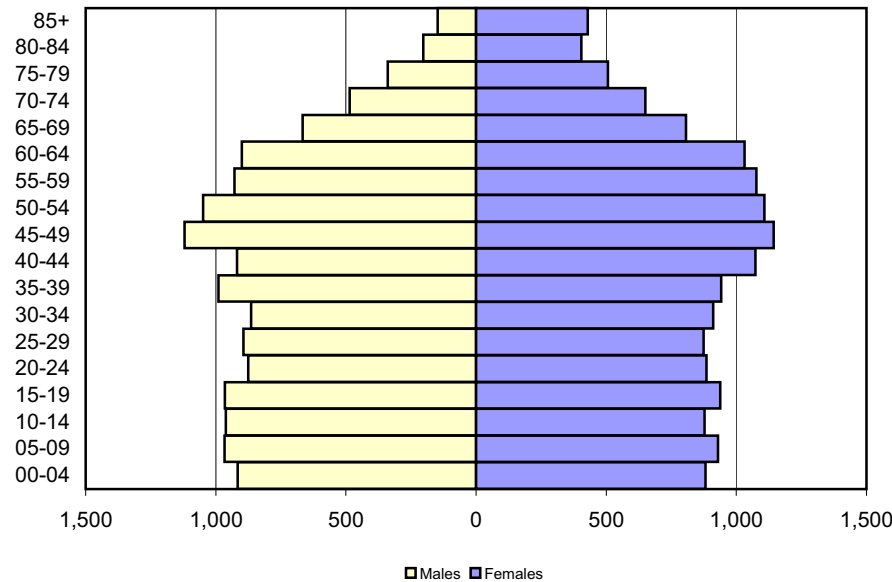

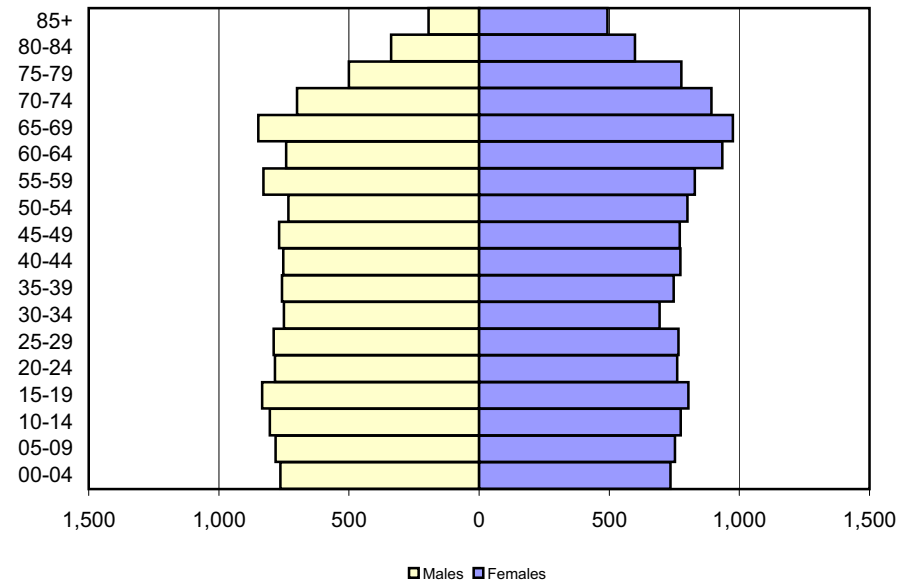

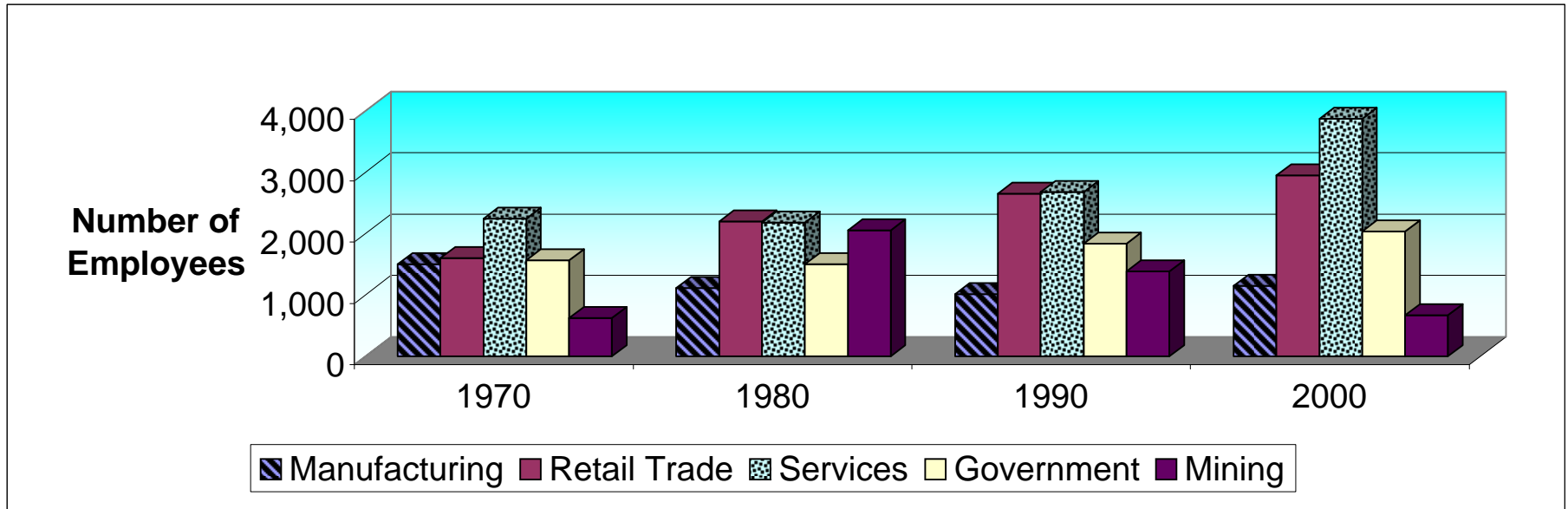
