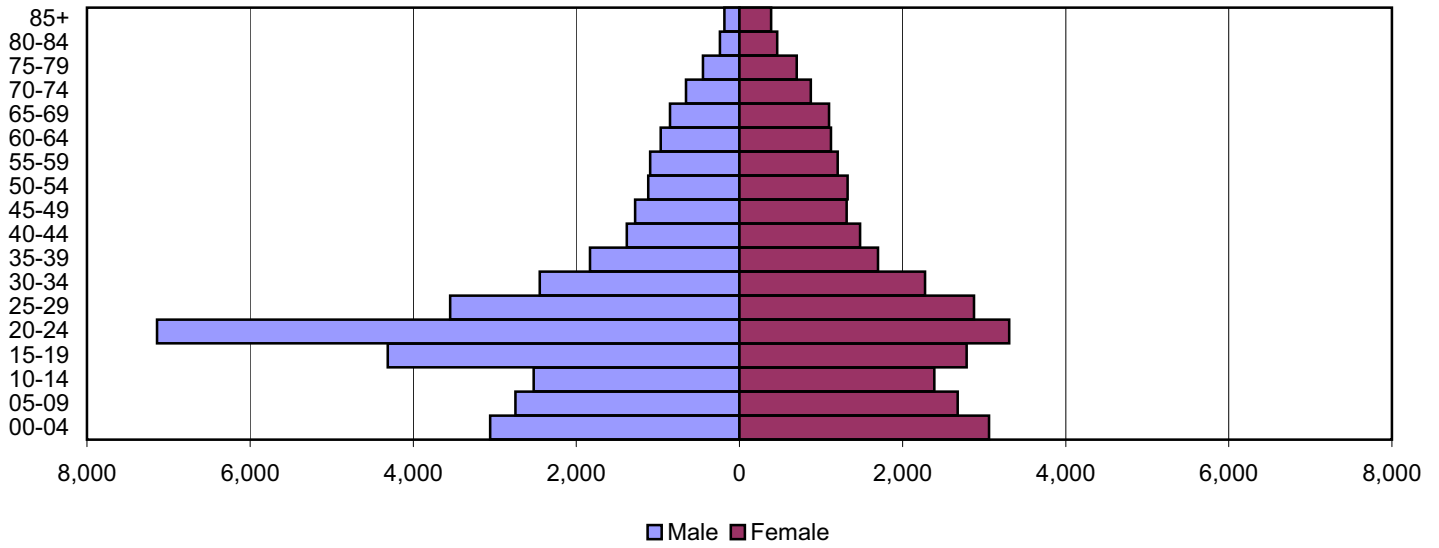

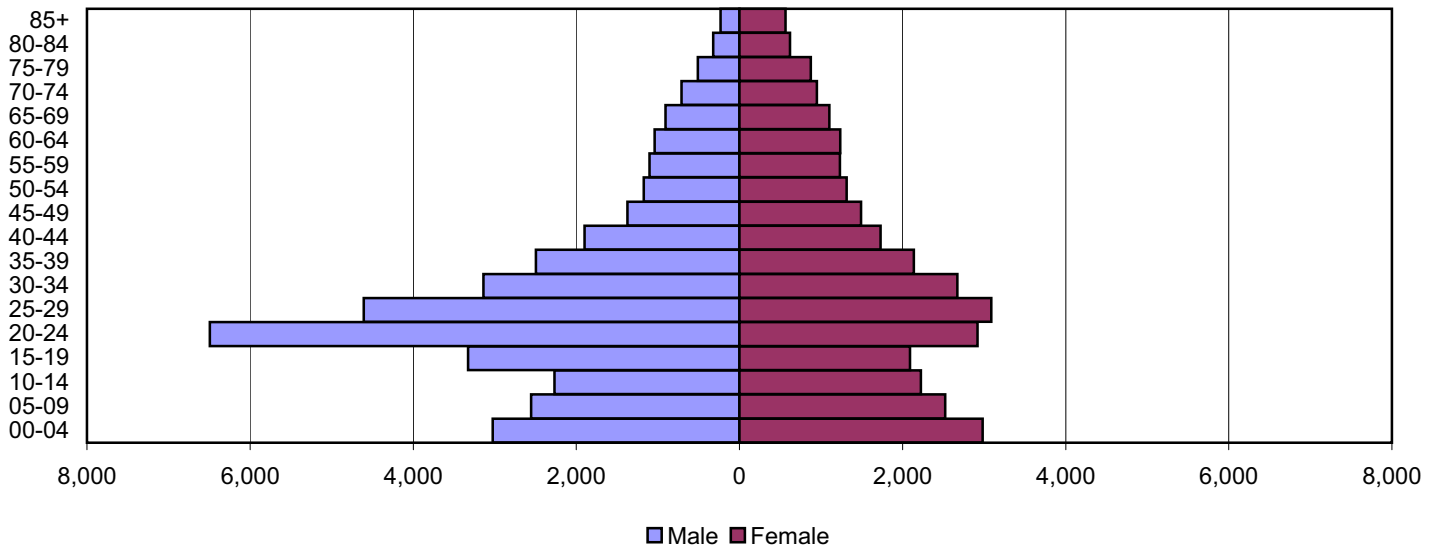

Christian County Population Pyramids

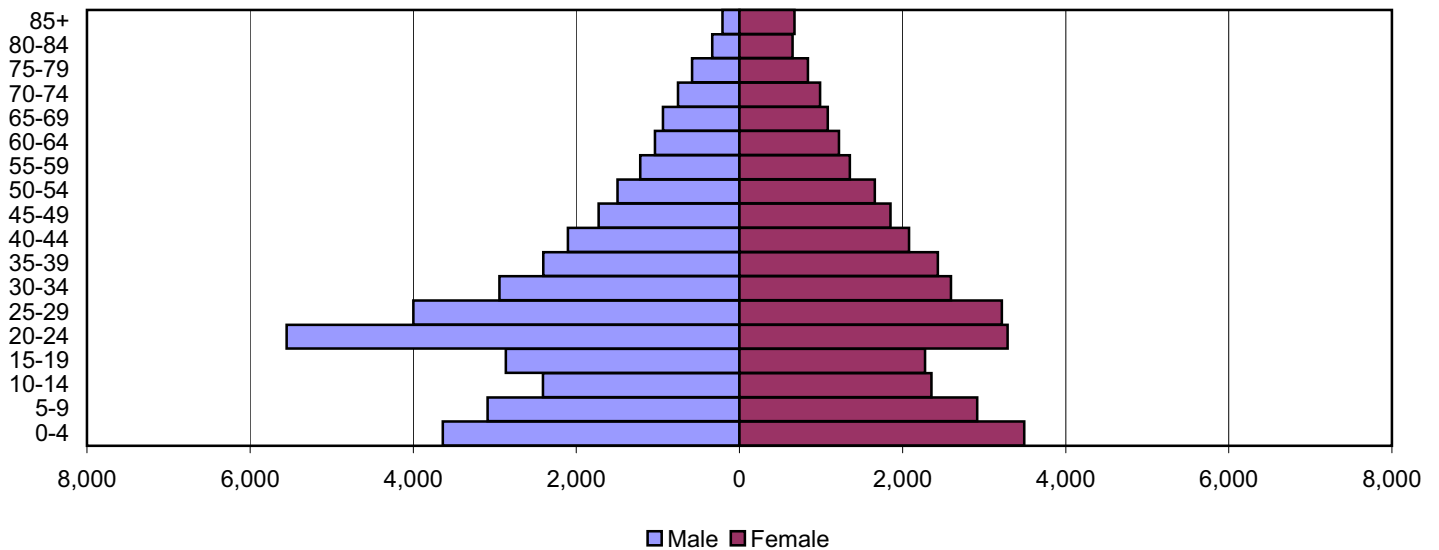

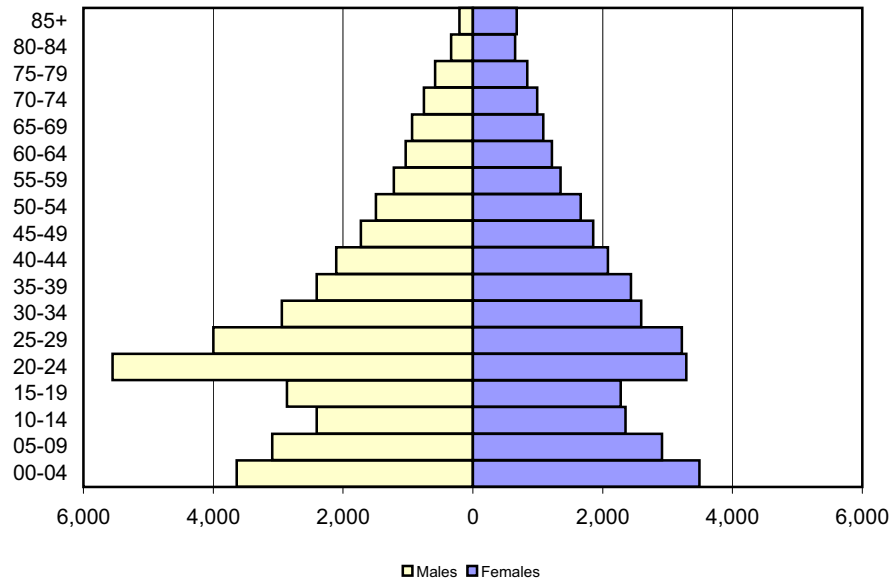

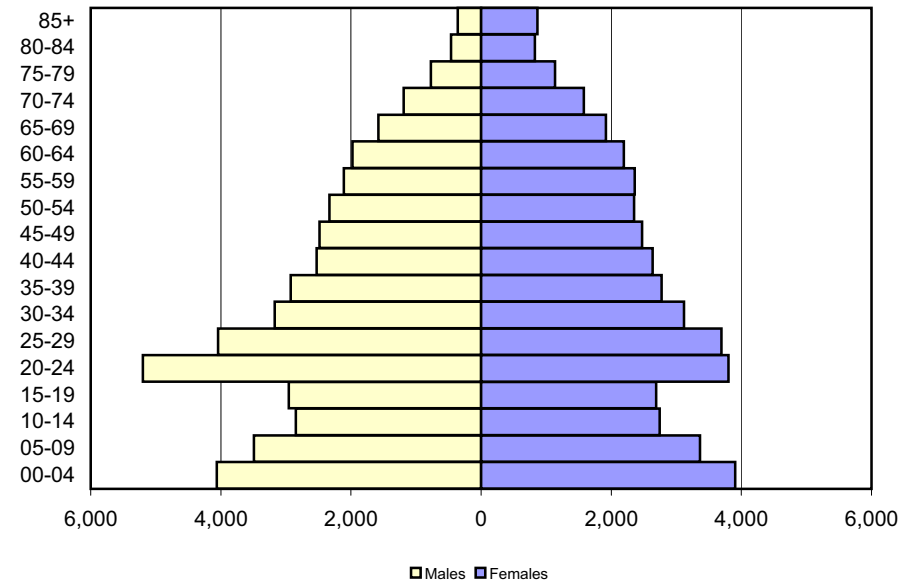

Christian County Population Pyramids

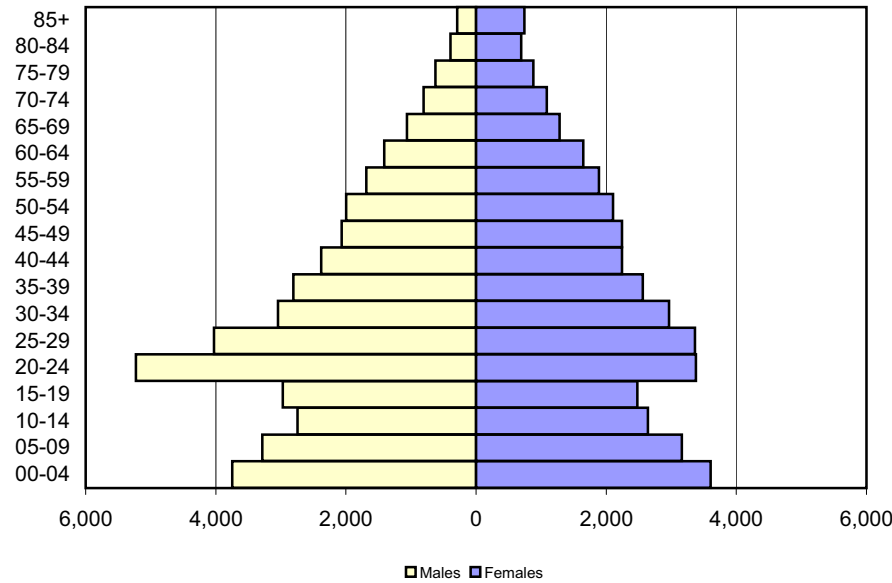

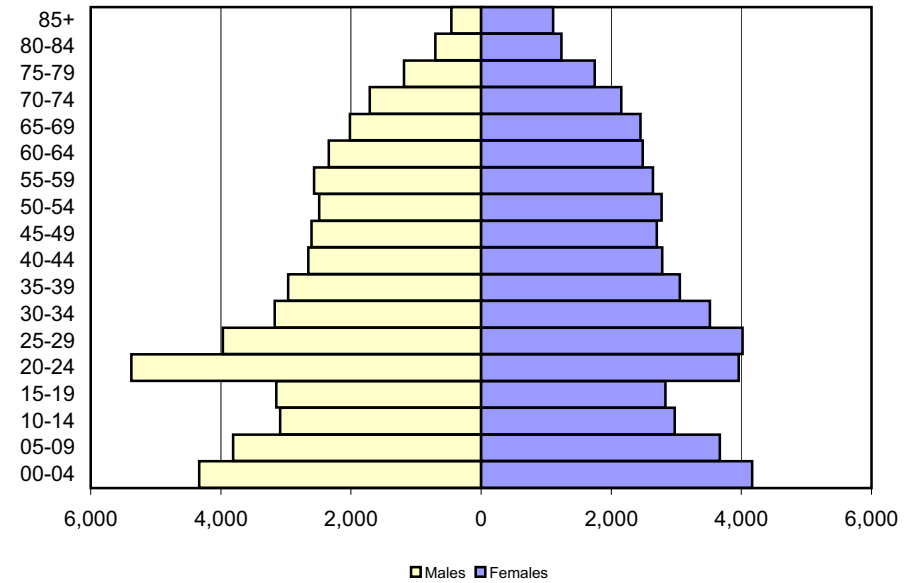

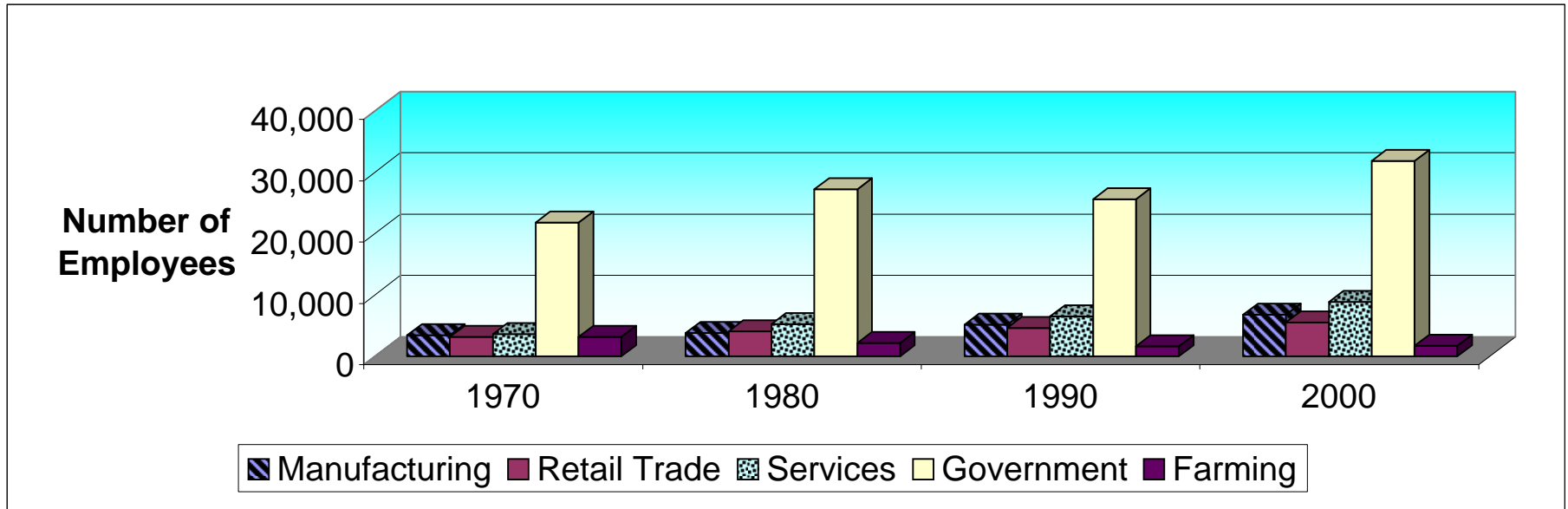
