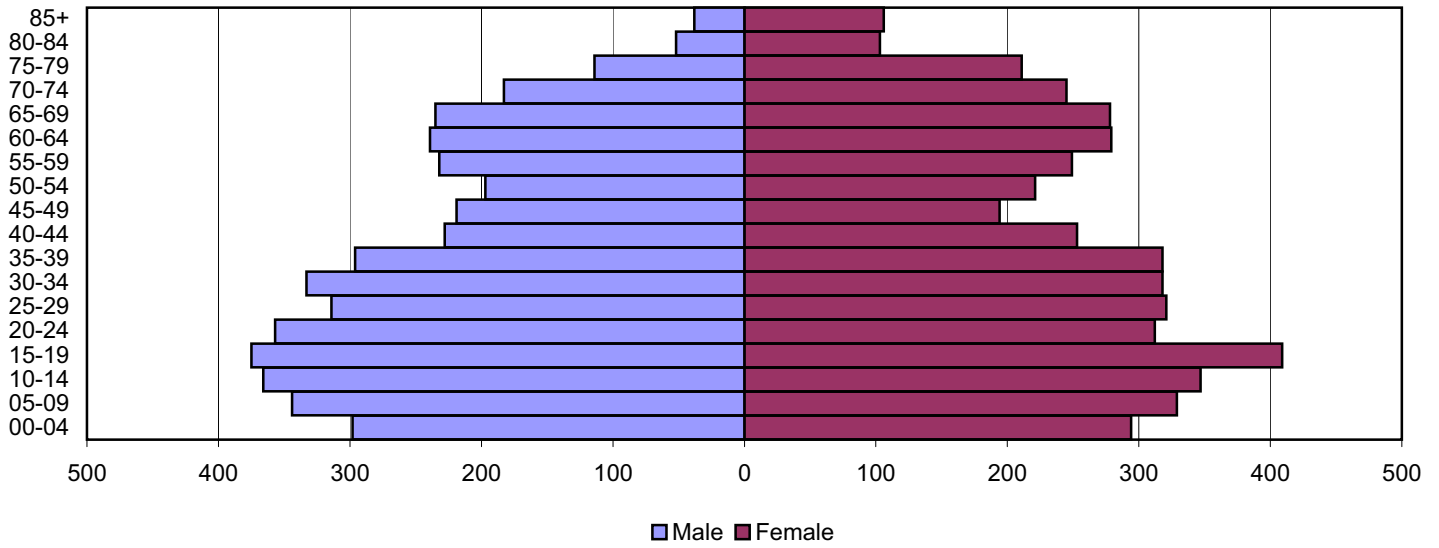

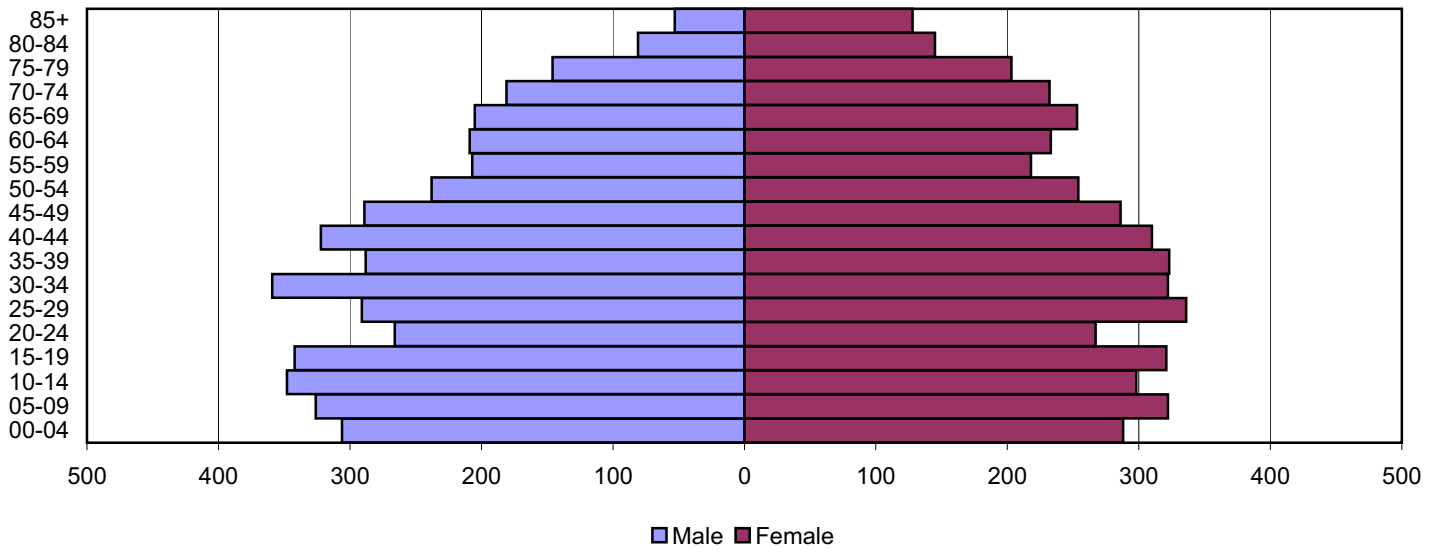

Crittenden County Population Pyramids

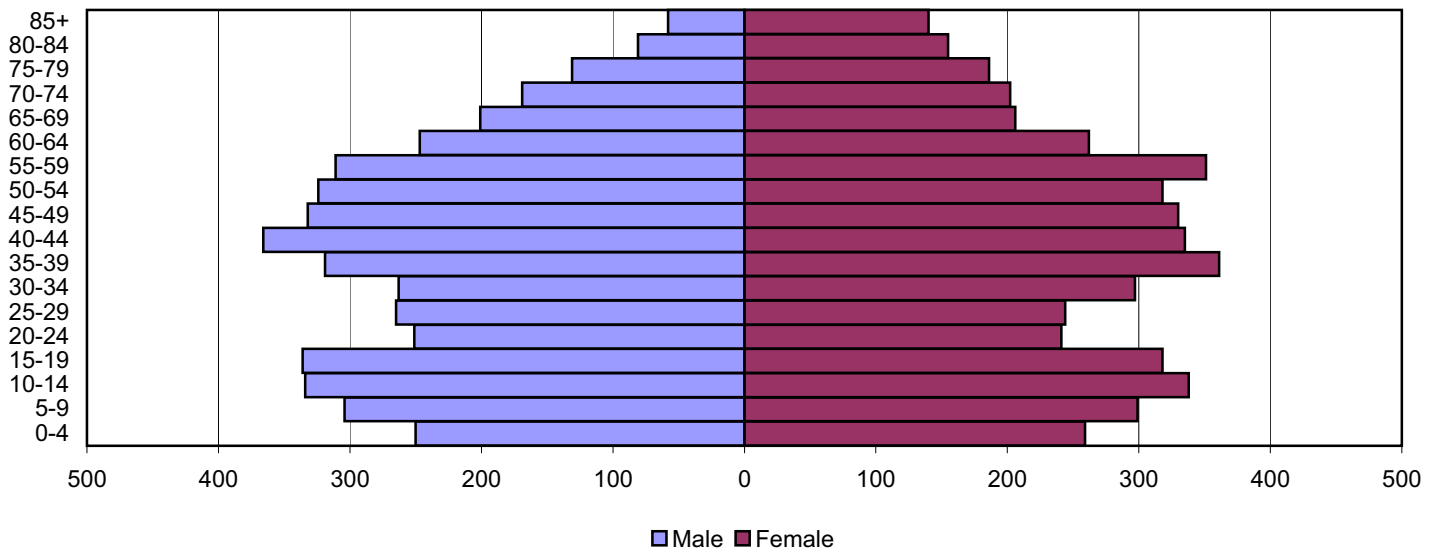

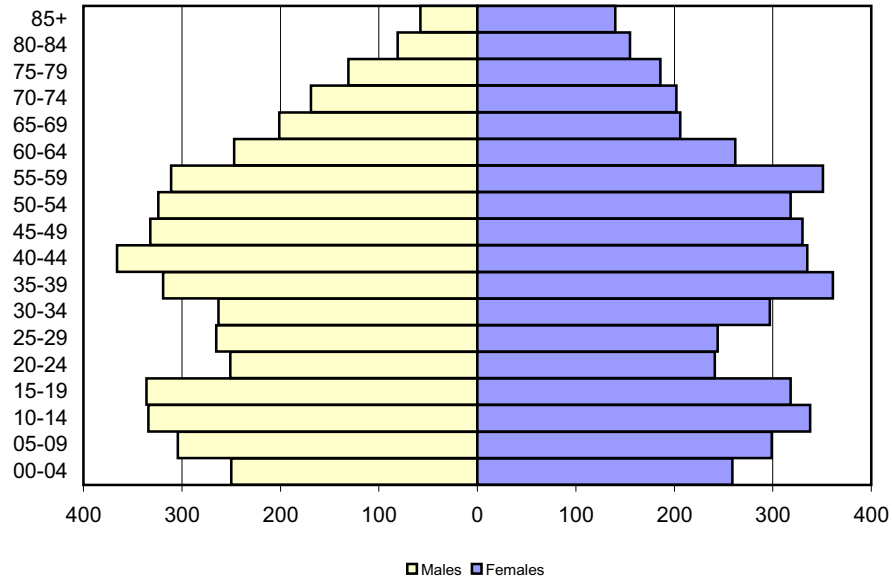

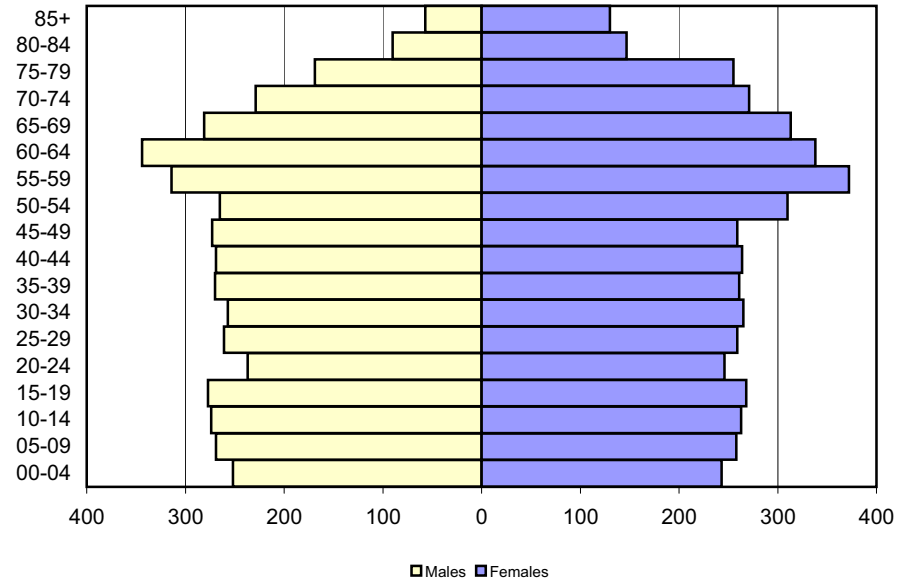

Crittenden County Population Pyramids

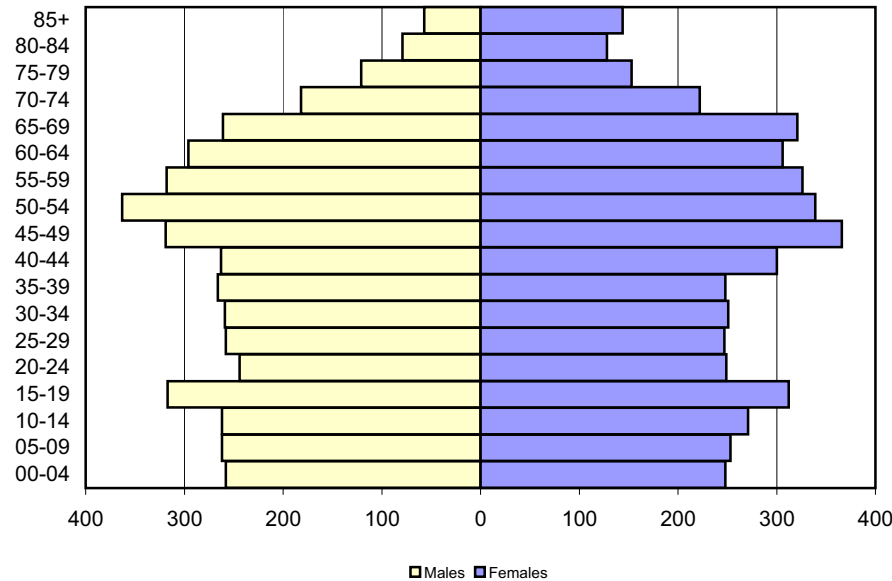

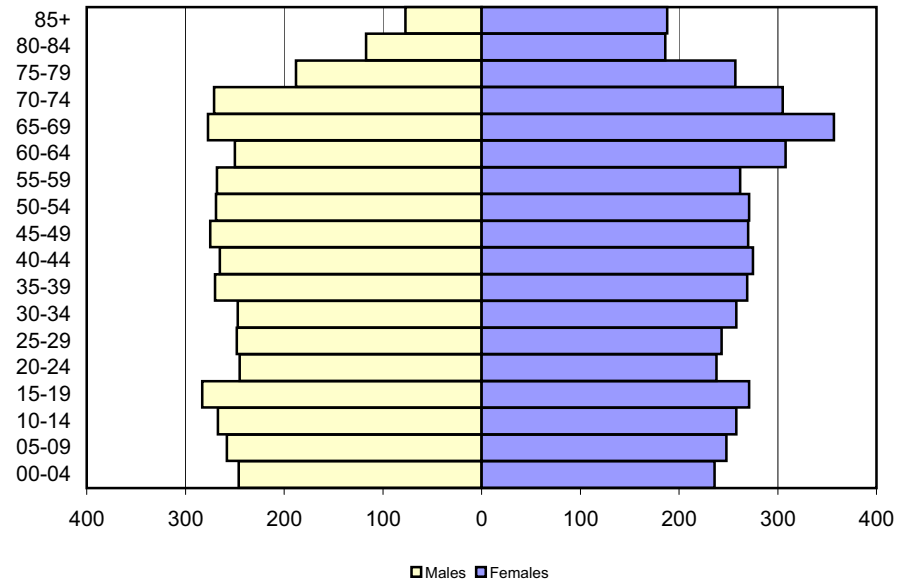

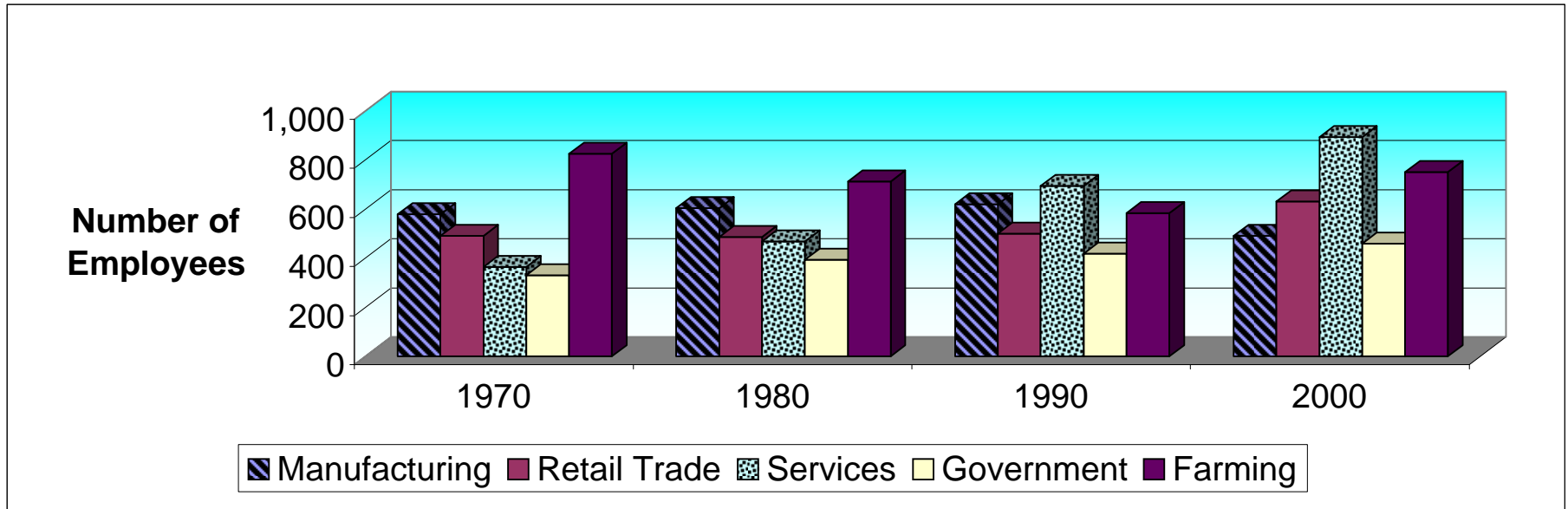
