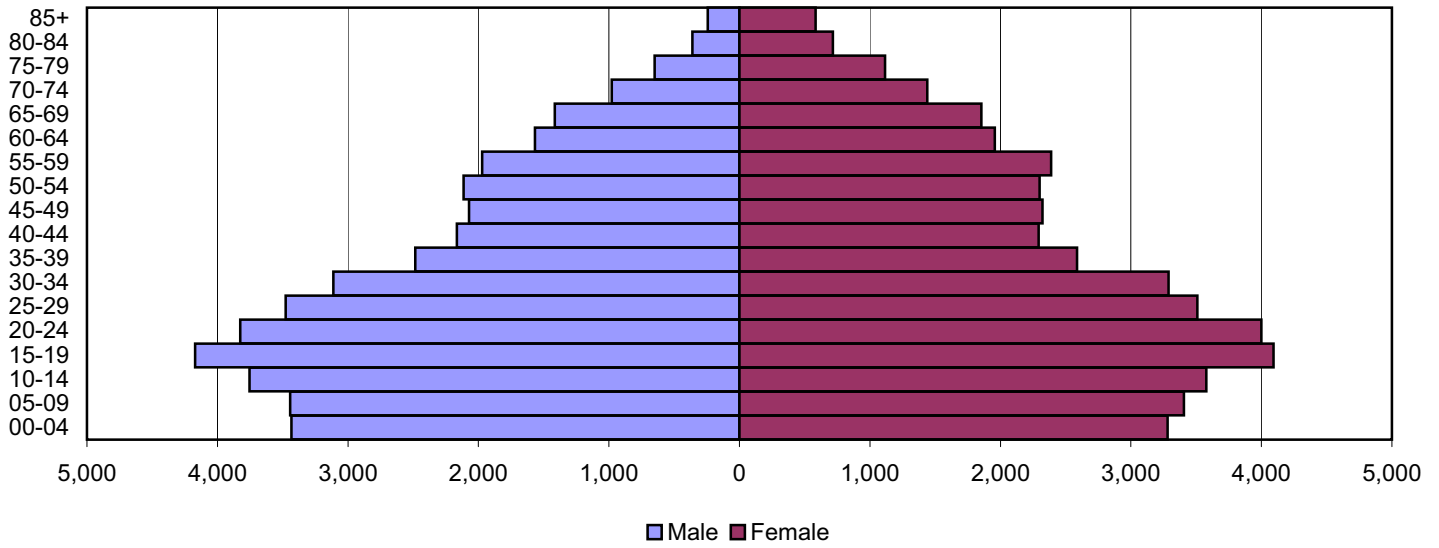

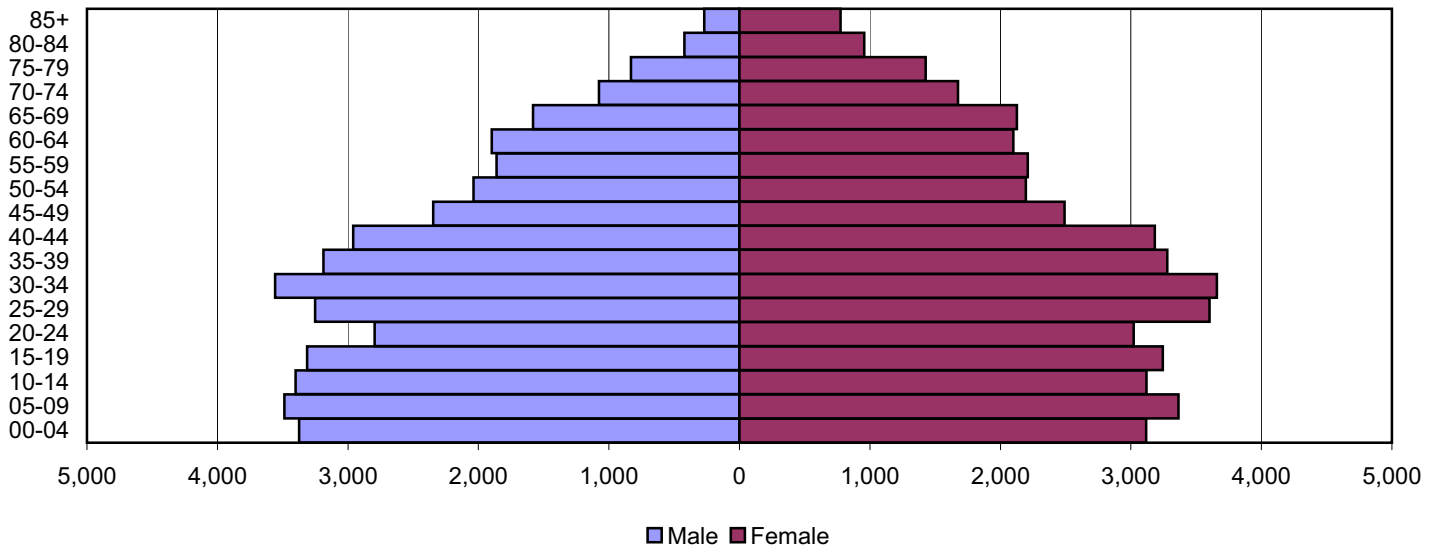

Daviess County Population Pyramids

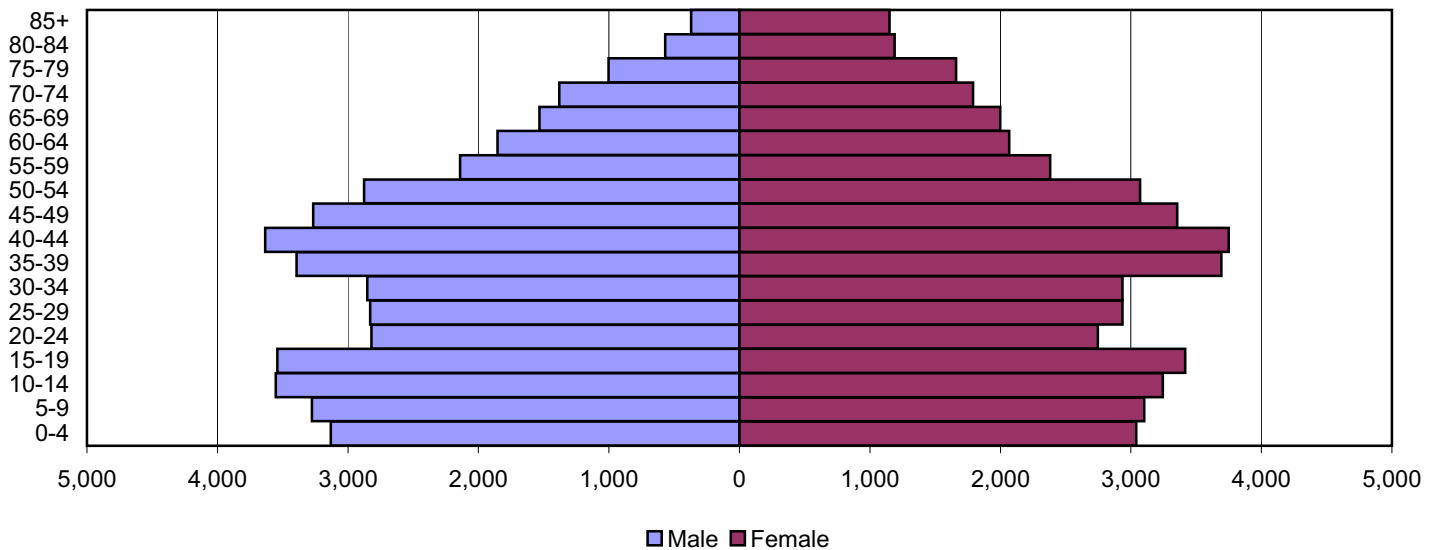

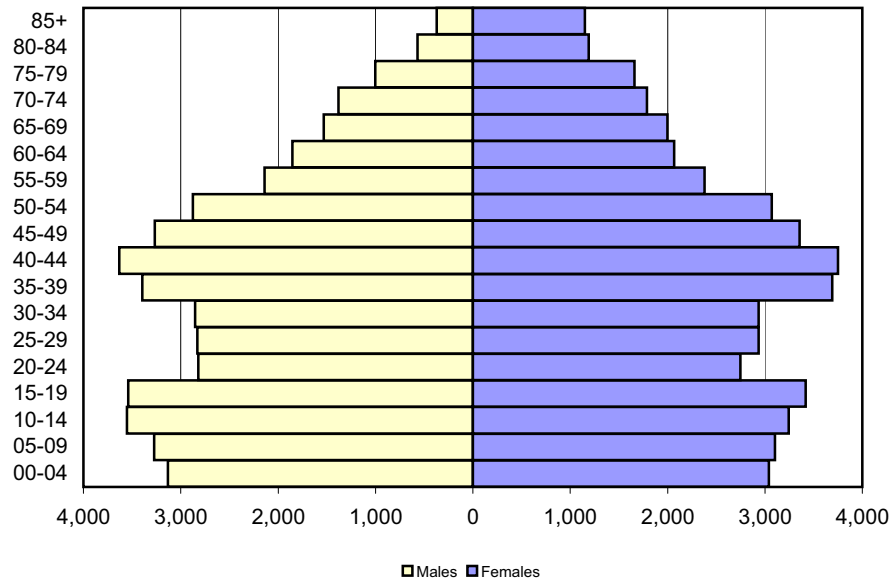

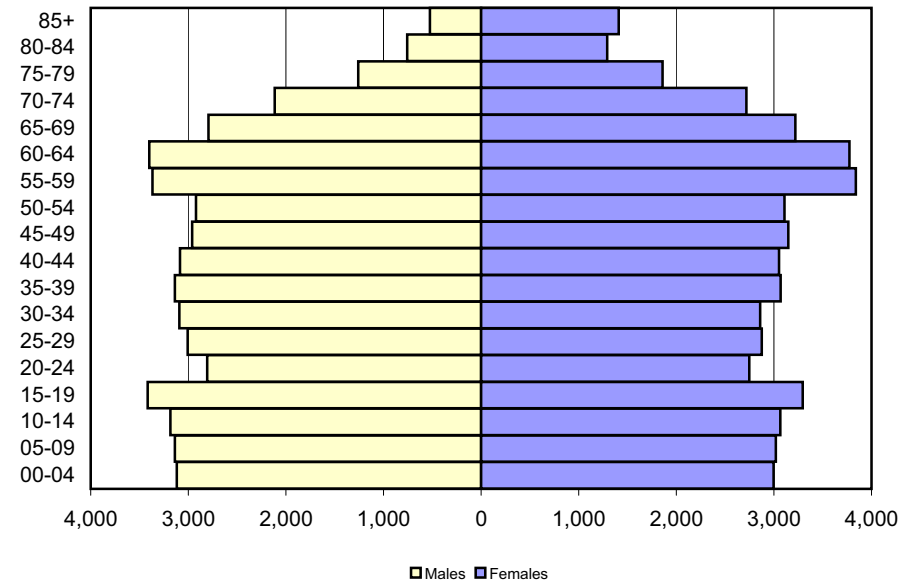

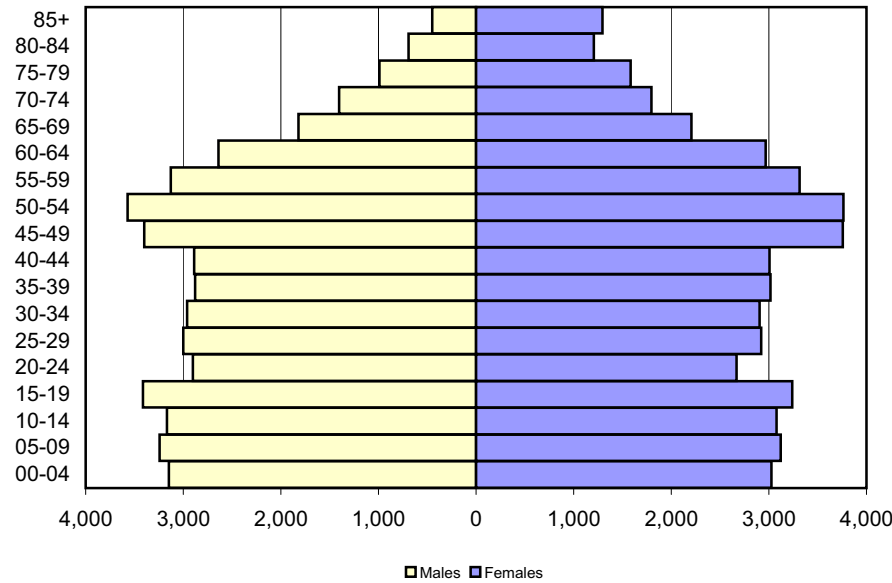

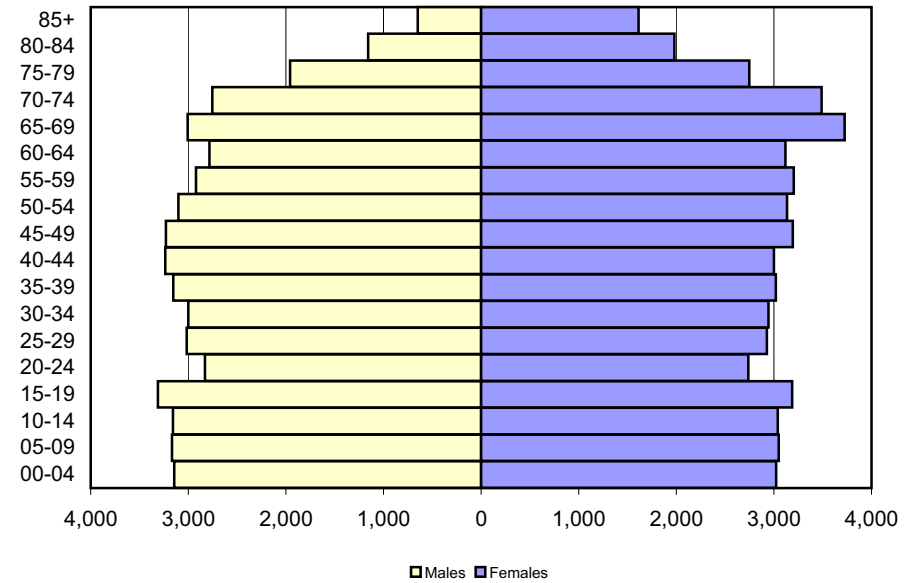

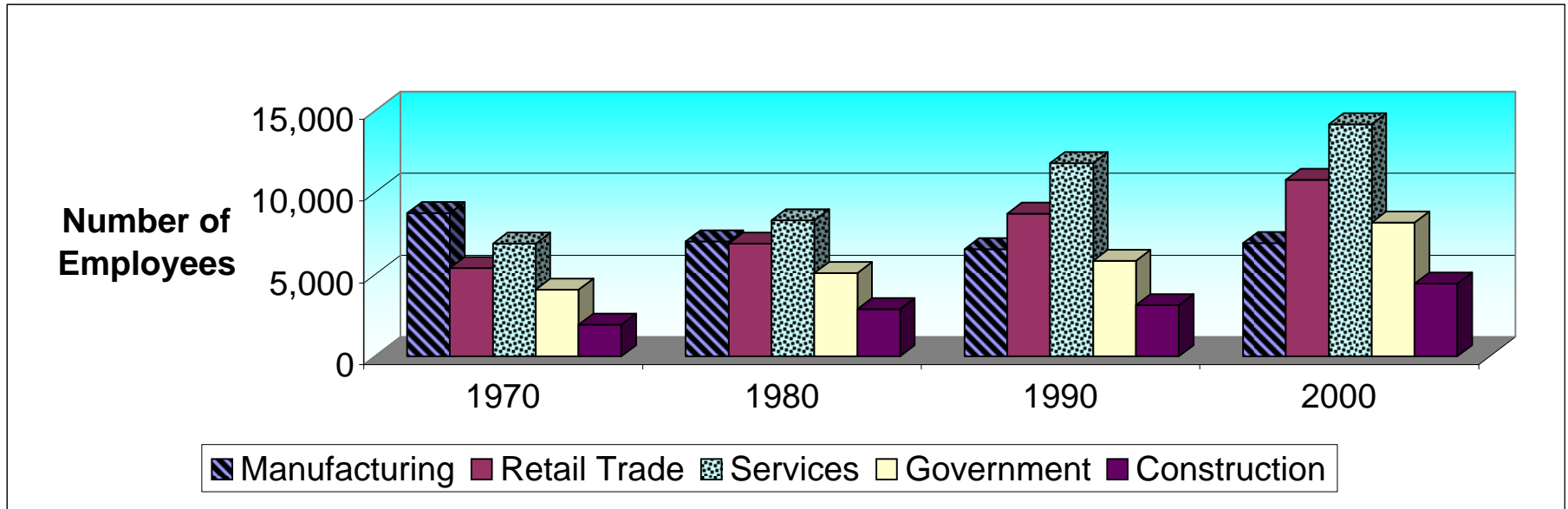
