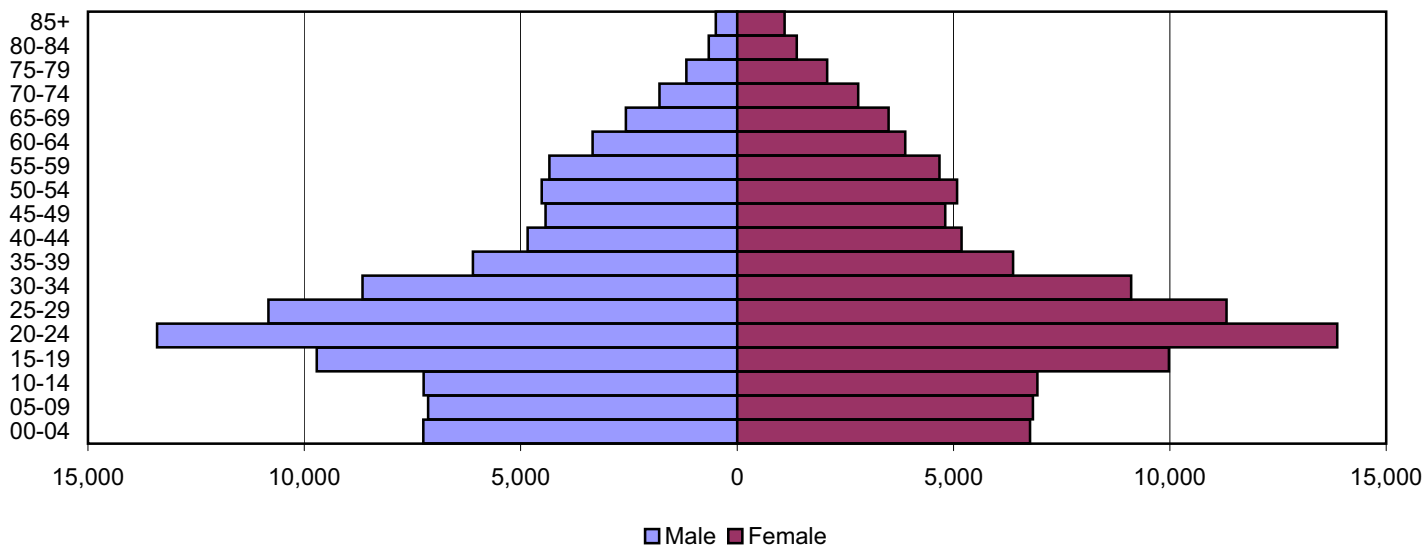

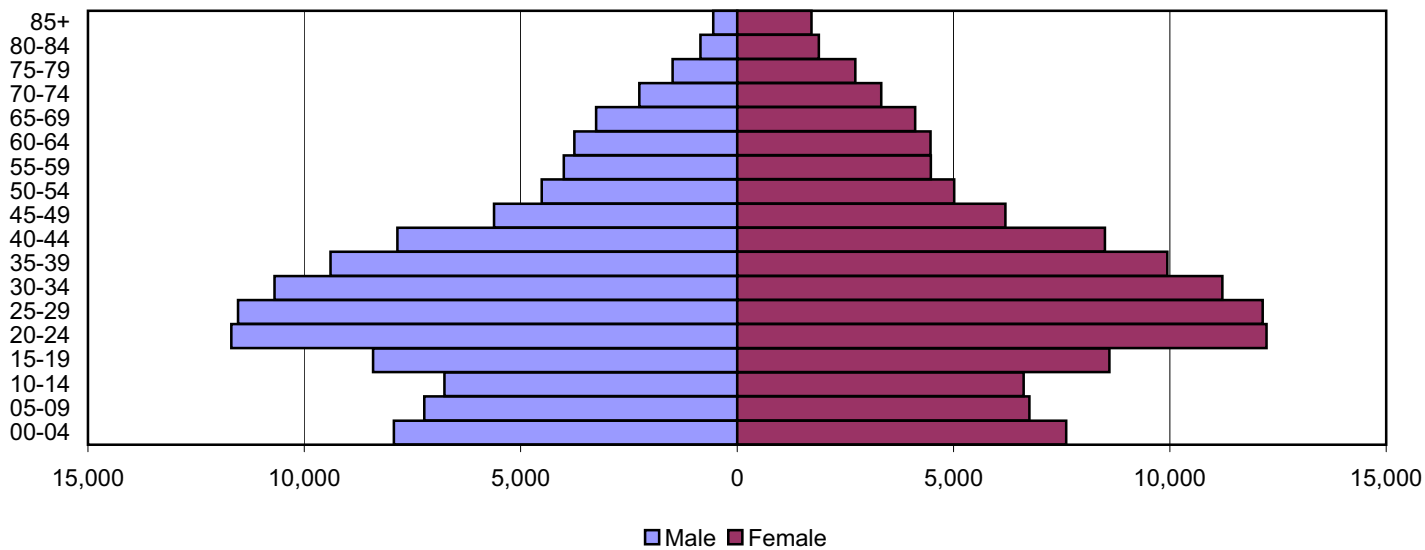

Fayette County Population Pyramids

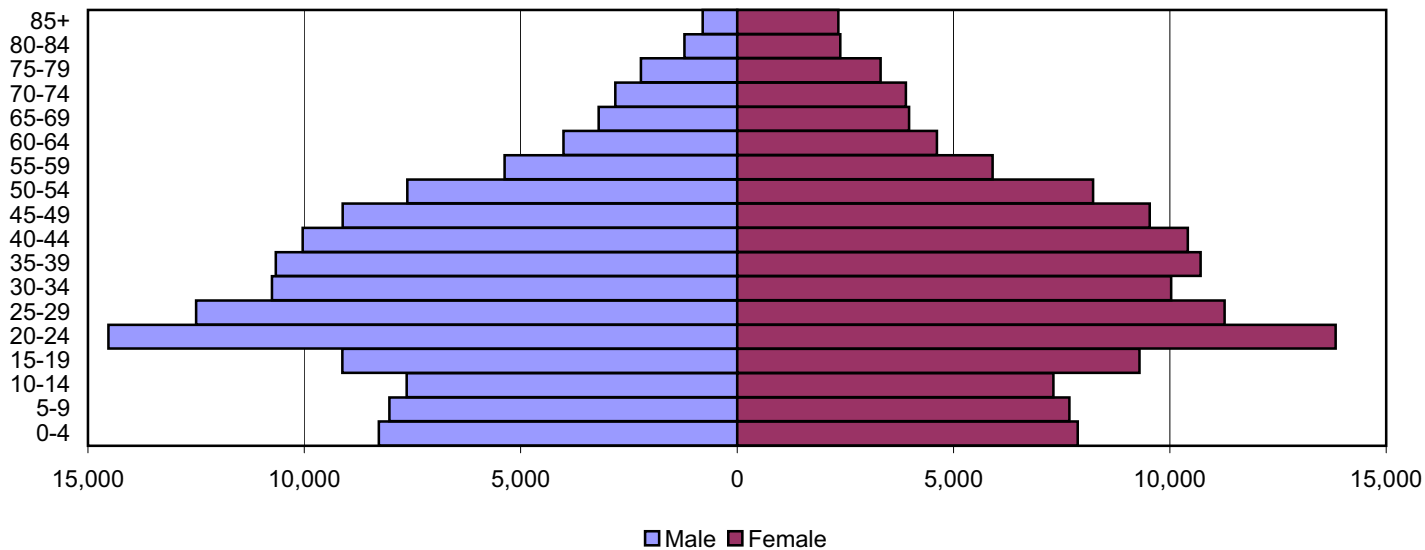

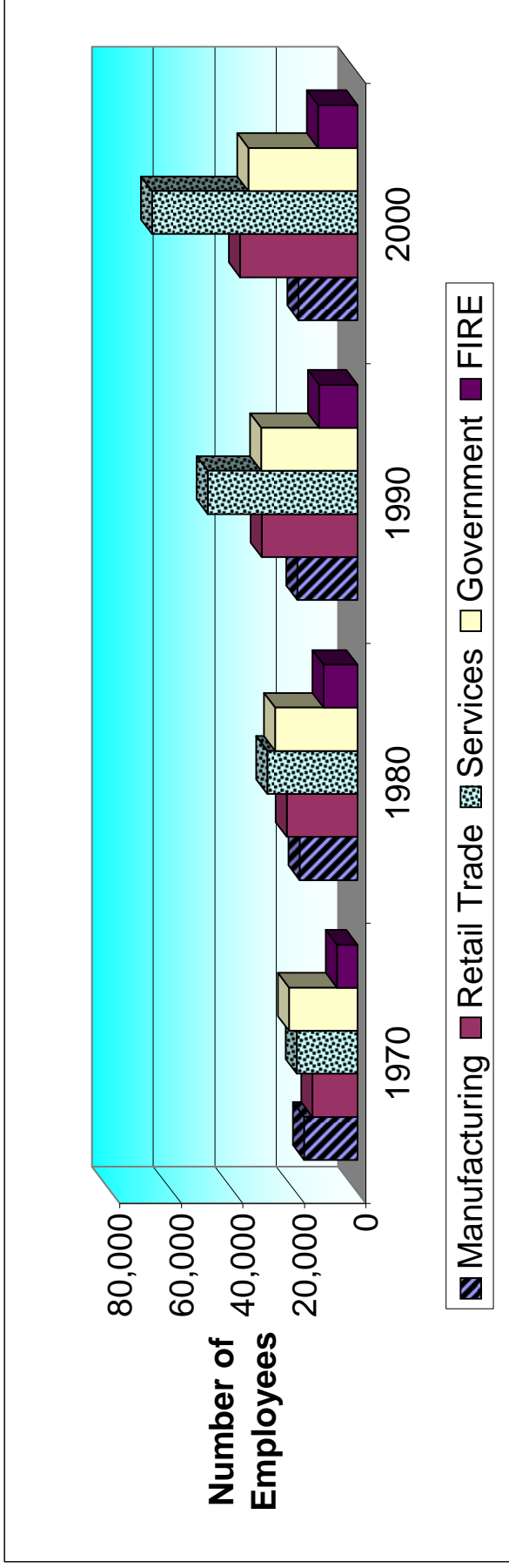
