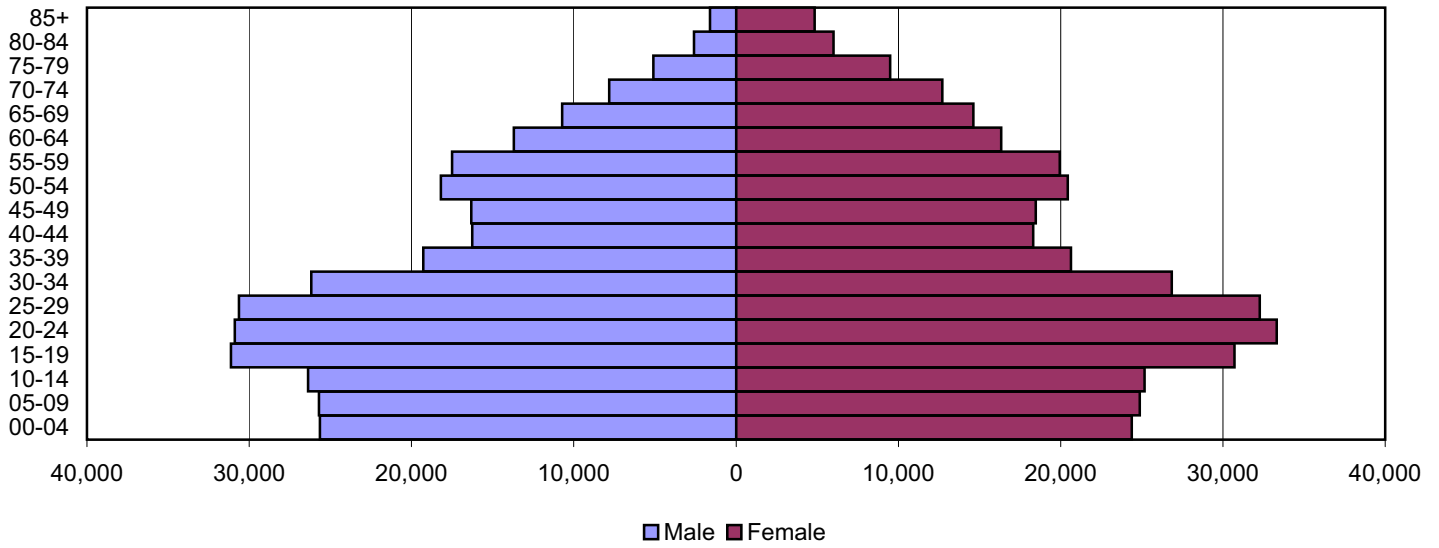

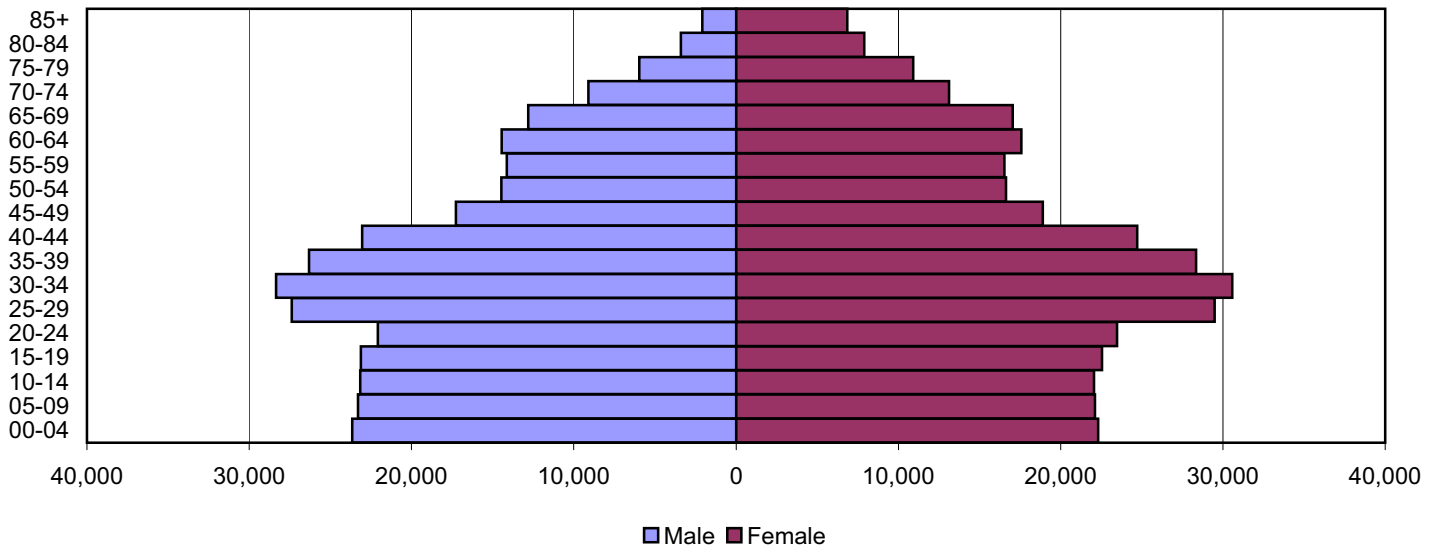

Jefferson County Population Pyramids

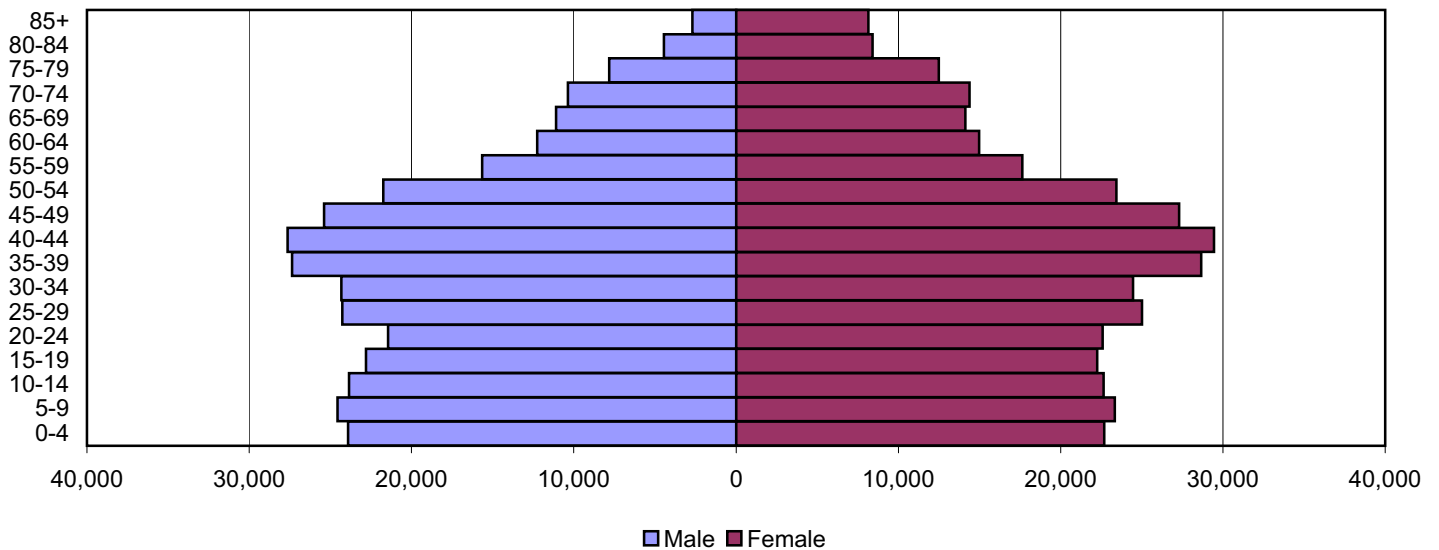

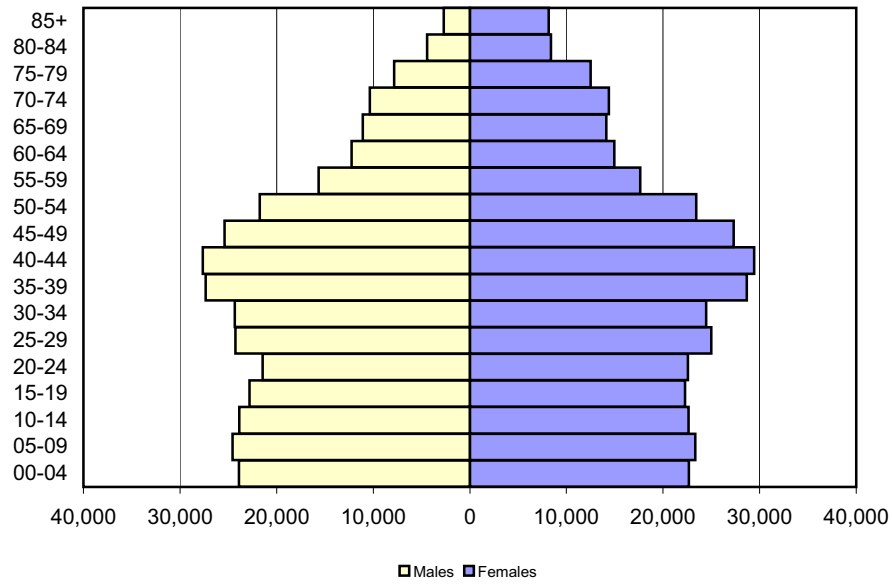

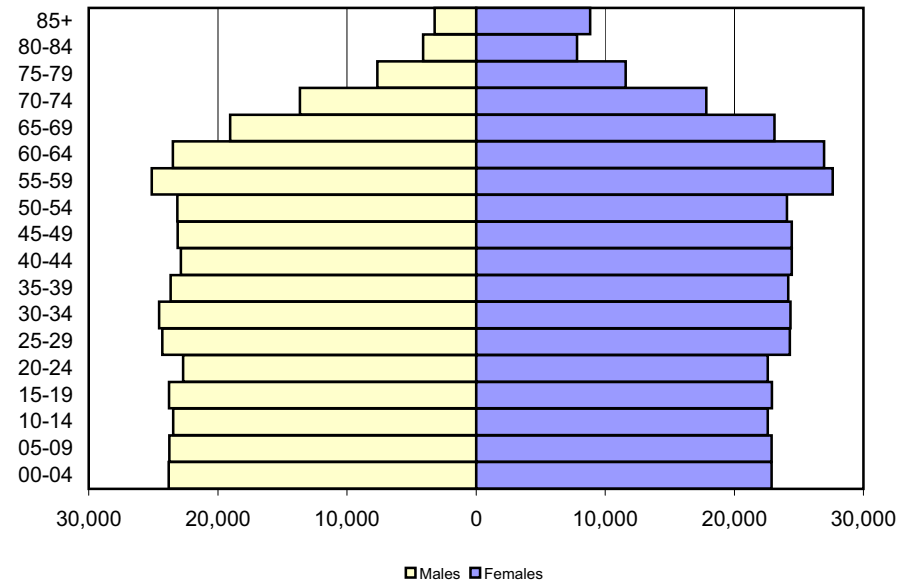

Jefferson County Population Pyramids

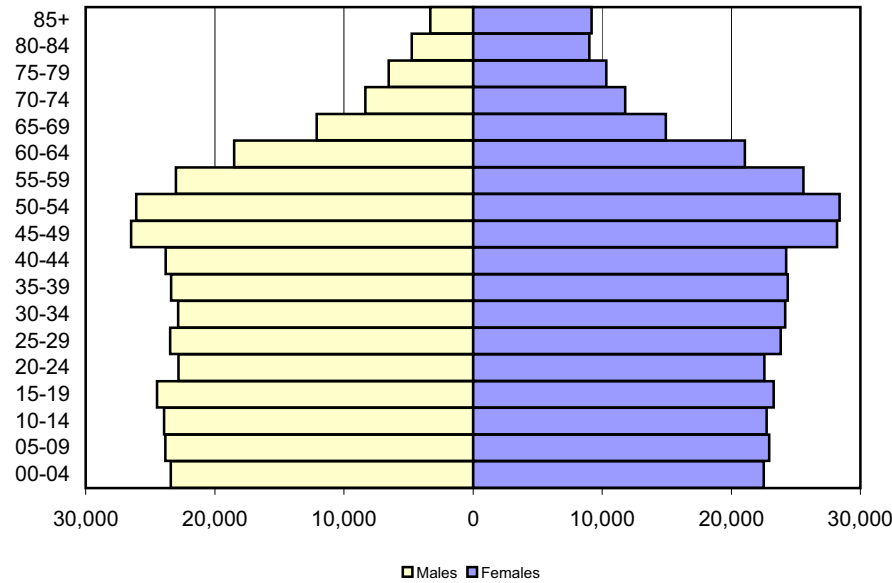

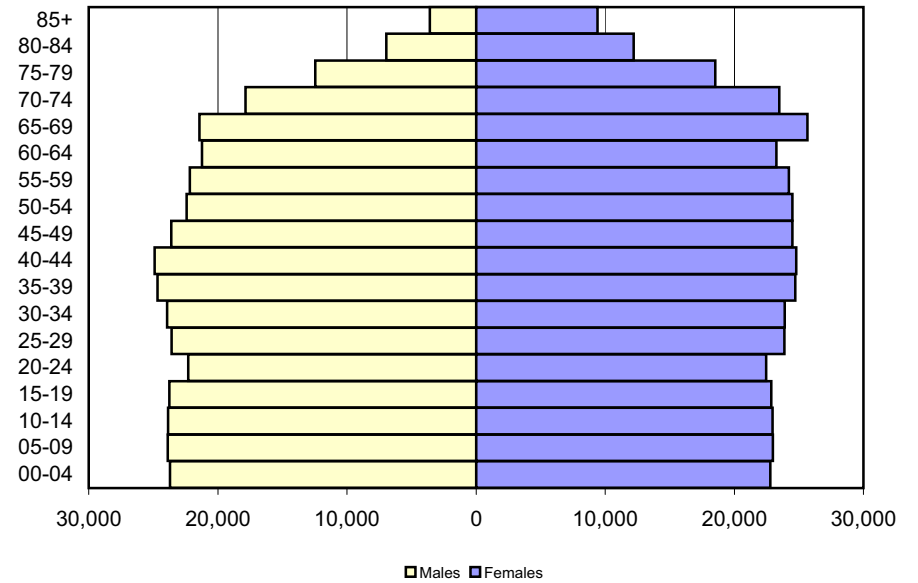

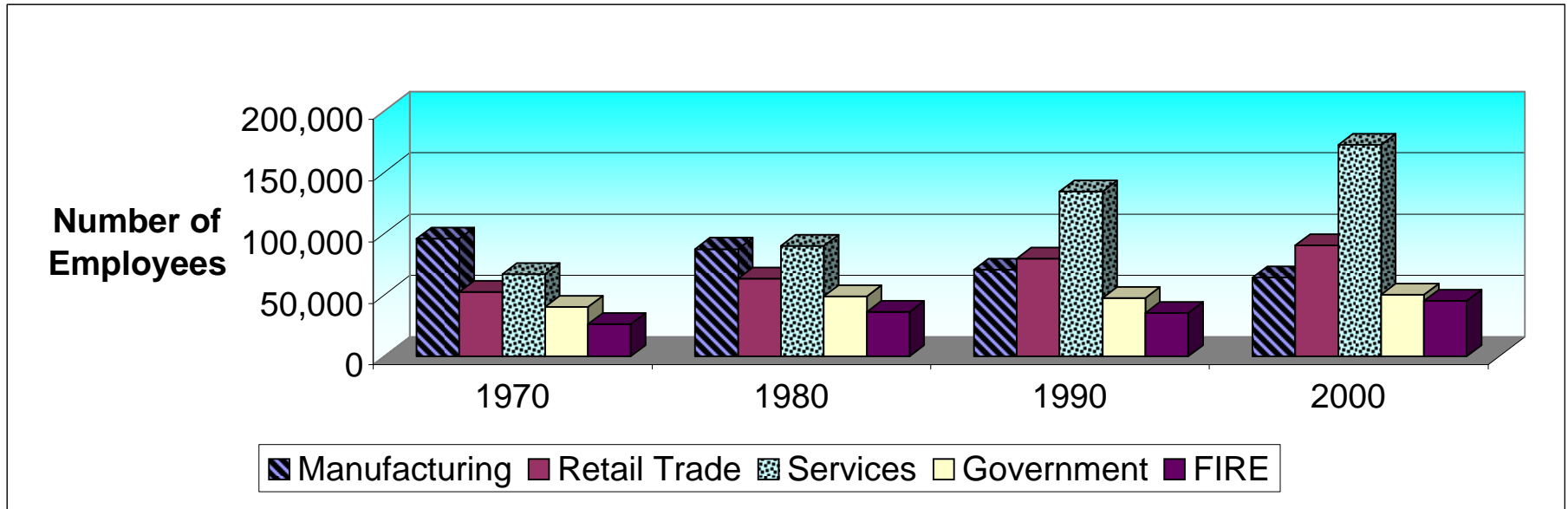
