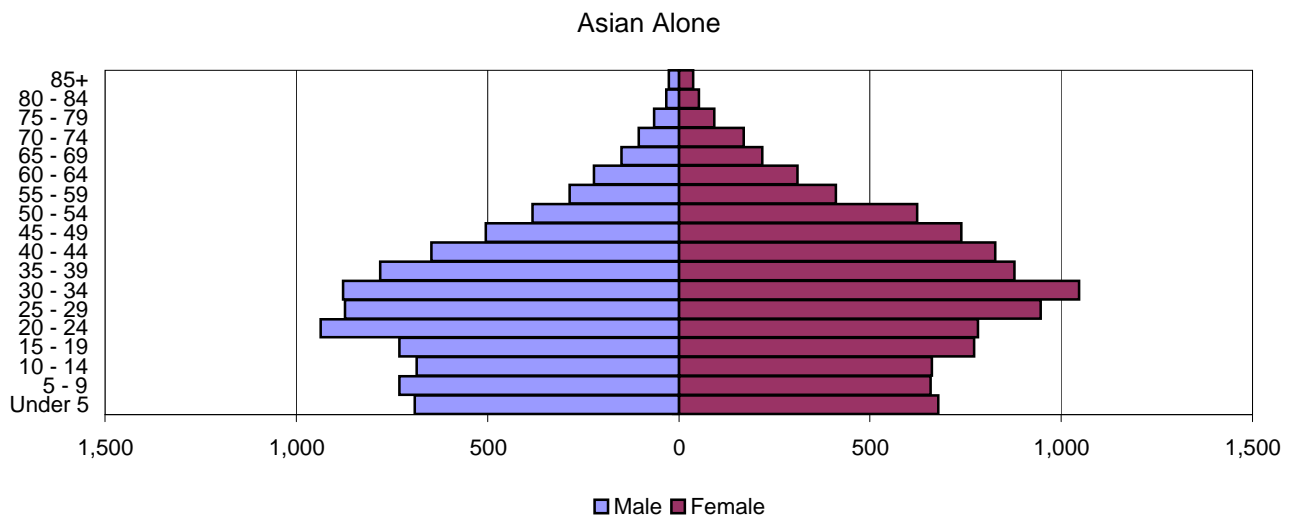
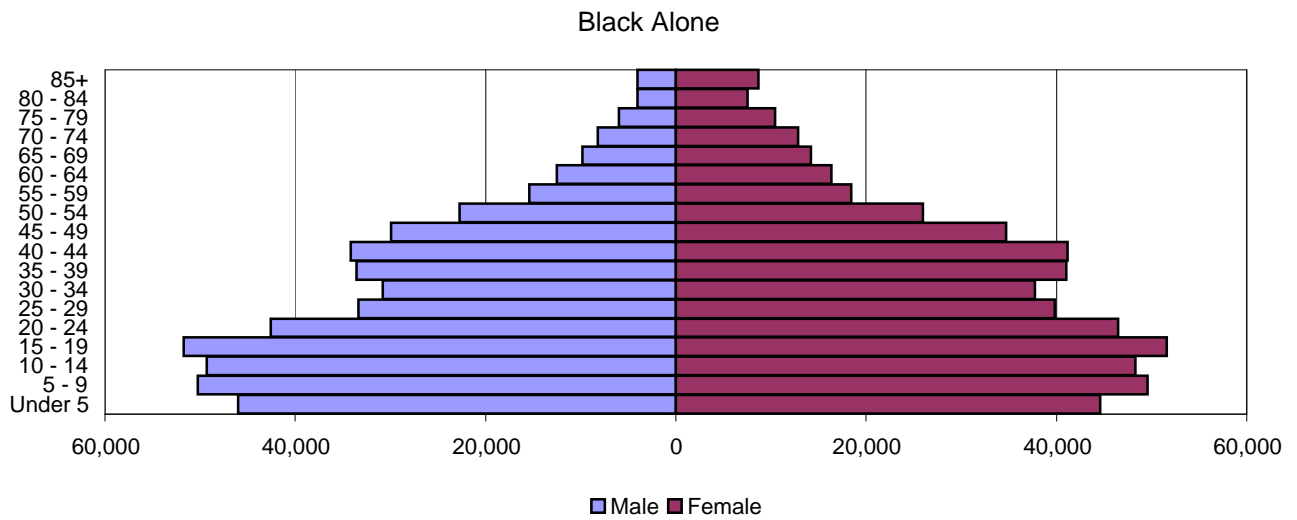
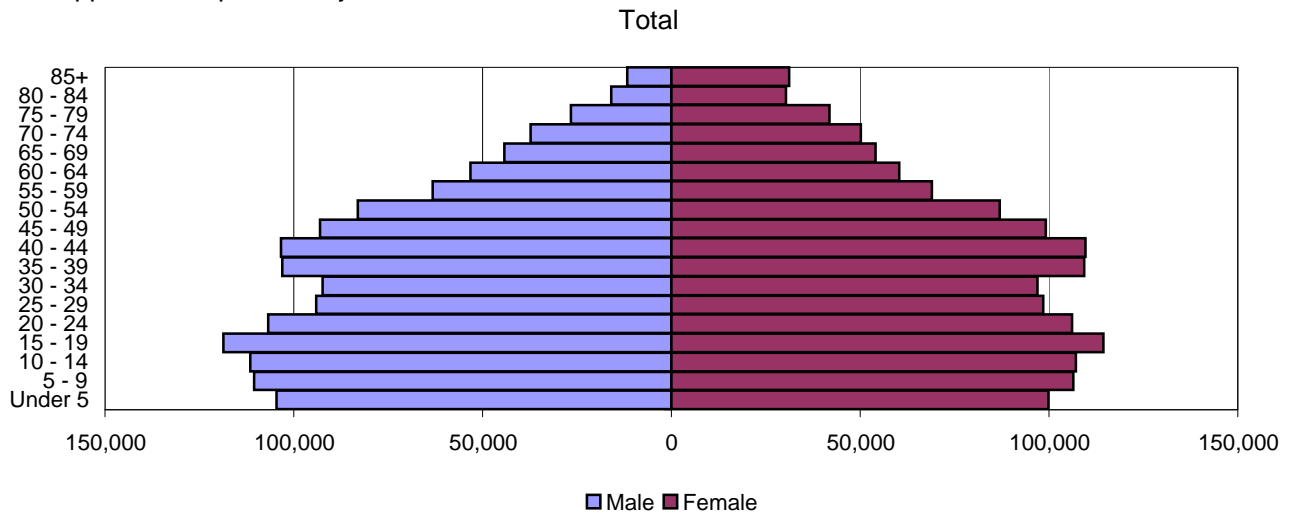
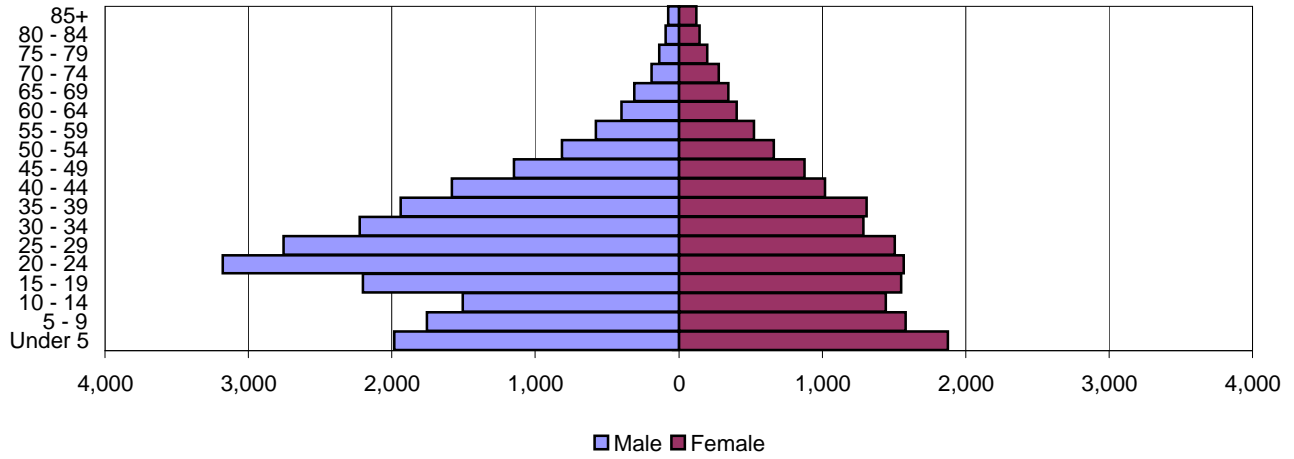


Mississippi 2000 Population Pyramids

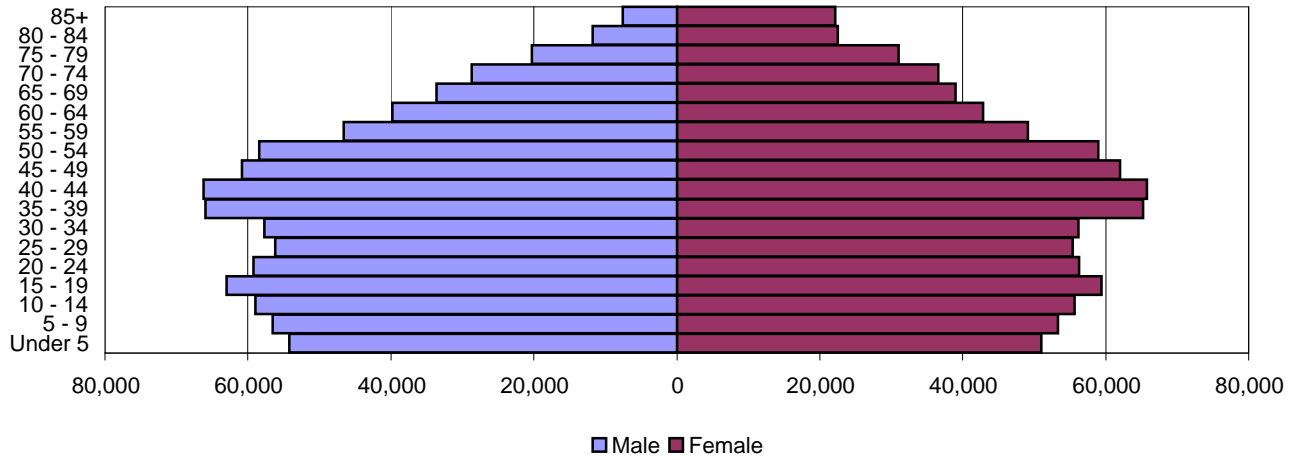

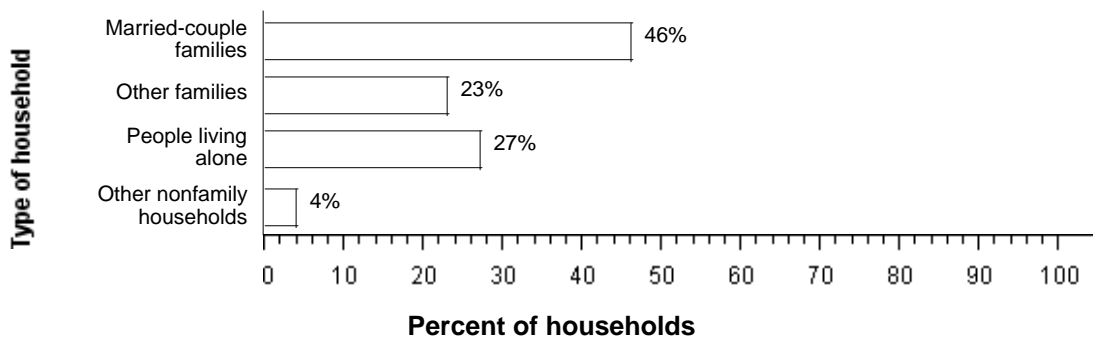
NOTE. Although the American Community Survey (ACS) produces population, demographic and housing unit estimates, it is the Census Bureau's Population Estimates Program that produces and disseminates the official estimates of the population for the nation, states, counties, cities and towns and estimates of housing units for states and counties.

**HOUSEHOLDS AND FAMILIES:** In 2006 there were 1.1 million households in Mississippi. The average household size was 2.6 people.

Families made up 69 percent of the households in Mississippi. This figure includes both married-couple families (46 percent) and other families (23 percent). Nonfamily households made up 31 percent of all households in Mississippi. Most of the nonfamily households were people living alone, but some were composed of people living in households in which no one was related to the householder.

**The Types of Households in Mississippi in 2006**



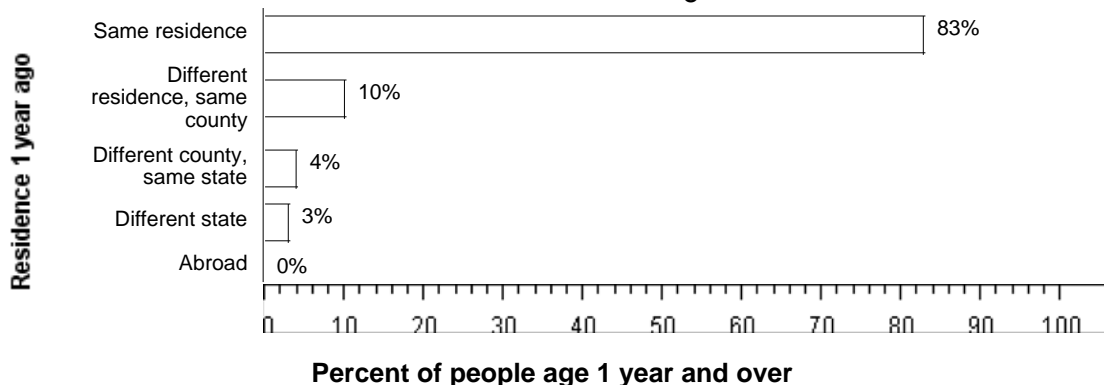

**NATIVITY AND LANGUAGE:** Two percent of the people living in Mississippi in 2006 were foreign born. Ninety-eight percent was native, including 73 percent who were born in Mississippi.

Among people at least five years old living in Mississippi in 2006, 3 percent spoke a language other than English at home. Of those speaking a language other than English at home, 55 percent spoke Spanish and 45 percent spoke some other language; 42 percent reported that they did not speak English "very well."

**GEOGRAPHIC MOBILITY:** In 2006, 83 percent of the people at least one year old living in Mississippi were living in the same residence one year earlier; 10 percent had moved during the past year from another residence in the same county, 4 percent from another county in the same state, 3 percent from another state, and less than 0.5 percent from abroad.

### Geographic Mobility of Residents of Mississippi in 2006

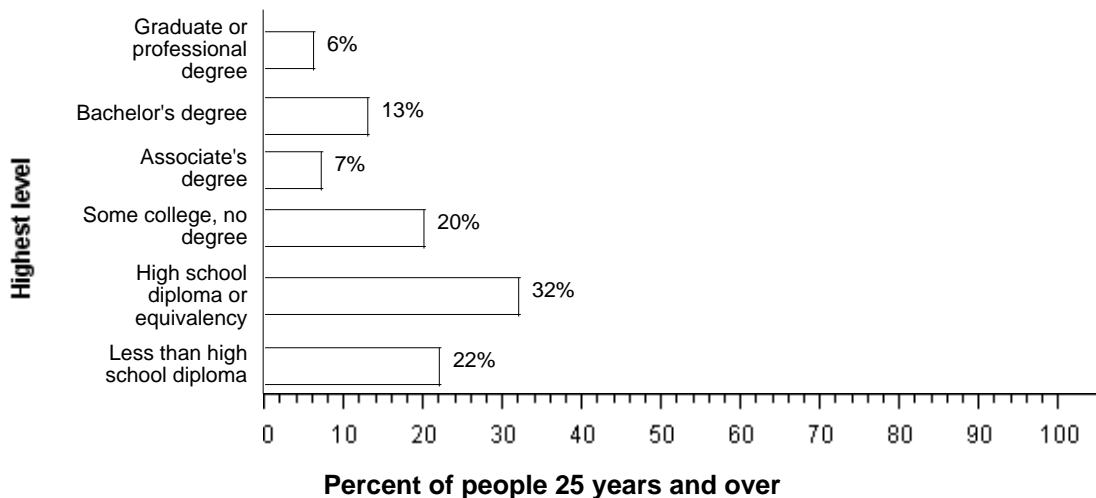

**EDUCATION:** In 2006, 78 percent of people 25 years and over had at least graduated from high school and 19 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. Twenty-two percent were dropouts; they were not enrolled in school and had not graduated from high school.

The total school enrollment in Mississippi was 787,000 in 2006. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was 91,000 and elementary or high school enrollment was 517,000 children. College or graduate school enrollment was 179,000.

#### The Educational Attainment of People in Mississippi in 2006

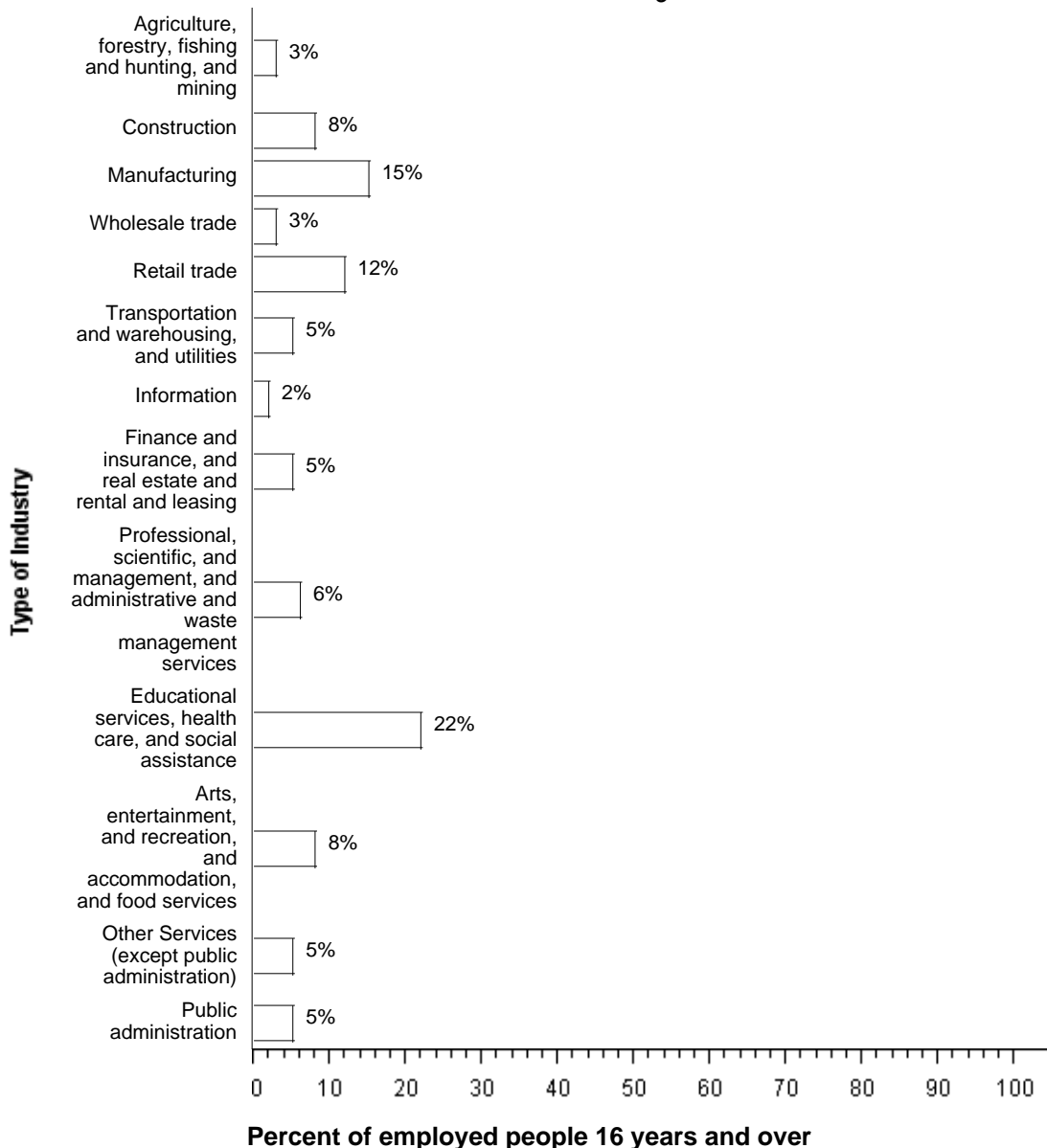

**DISABILITY:** In Mississippi, among people at least five years old in 2006, 21 percent reported a disability. The likelihood of having a disability varied by age - from 8 percent of people 5 to 15 years old, to 19 percent of people 16 to 64 years old, and to 52 percent of those 65 and older.

**INDUSTRIES:** In 2006, for the employed population 16 years and older, the leading industries in Mississippi were Educational services, and health care, and social assistance, 22 percent, and Manufacturing, 15 percent.

**OCCUPATIONS AND TYPE OF EMPLOYER:** Among the most common occupations were: Management, professional, and related occupations, 28 percent; Sales and office occupations, 24 percent; Production, transportation, and material moving occupations, 18 percent; Service occupations, 16 percent; and Construction, extraction, maintenance and repair occupations, 12 percent. Seventy-five percent of the people employed were Private wage and salary workers; 18 percent was Federal, state, or local government workers; and 7 percent was Self-employed in own not incorporated business workers.

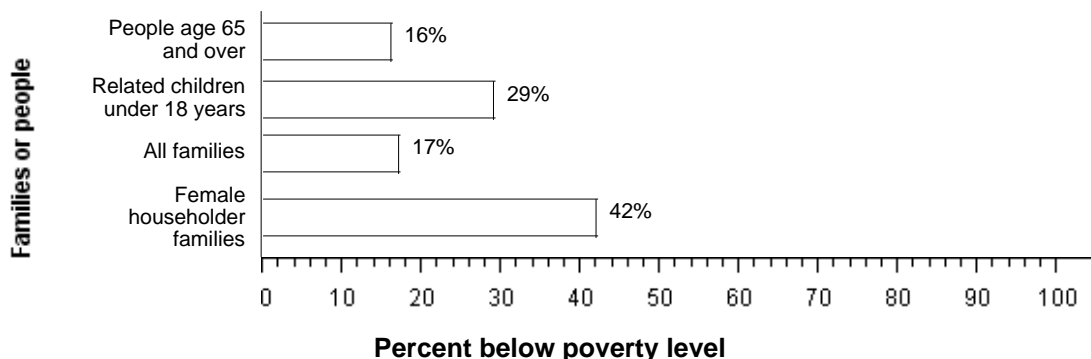
**TRAVEL TO WORK:** Eighty-two percent of Mississippi workers drove to work alone in 2006, 12 percent carpooled, less than 0.5 percent took public transportation, and 3 percent used other means. The remaining 2 percent worked at home. Among those who commuted to work, it took them on average 24 minutes to get to work.

**INCOME:** The median income of households in Mississippi was \$34,473. Seventy-six percent of the households received earnings and 17 percent received retirement income other than Social Security. Thirty-one percent of the households received Social Security. The average income from Social Security was \$12,482. These income sources are not mutually exclusive; that is, some households received income from more than one source.

**POVERTY AND PARTICIPATION IN GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS:** In 2006, 21 percent of people were in poverty. Twenty-nine percent of related children under 18 were below the

poverty level, compared with 16 percent of people 65 years old and over. Seventeen percent of all families and 42 percent of families with a female householder and no husband present had incomes below the poverty level.

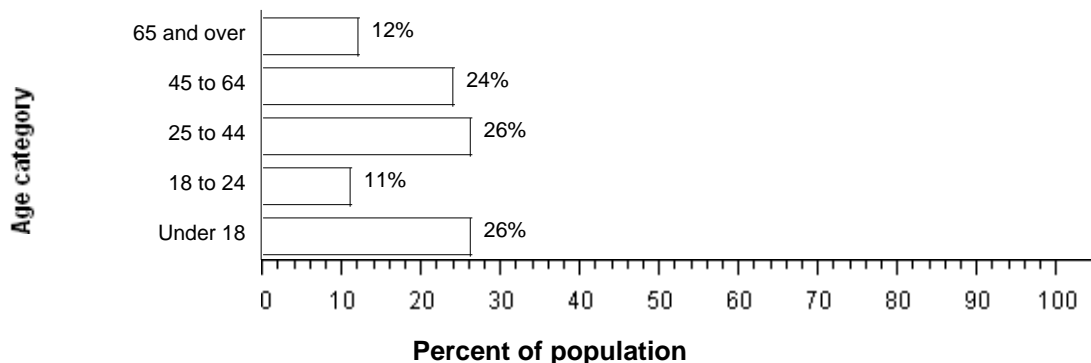
### Poverty Rates in Mississippi in 2006

**POPULATION OF Mississippi:** In 2006, Mississippi had a total population of 2.9 million - 1.5 million (51 percent) females and 1.4 million (49 percent) males. The median age was 35.4 years. Twenty-six percent of the population was under 18 years and 12 percent was 65 years and older.

### The Age Distribution of People in Mississippi in 2006

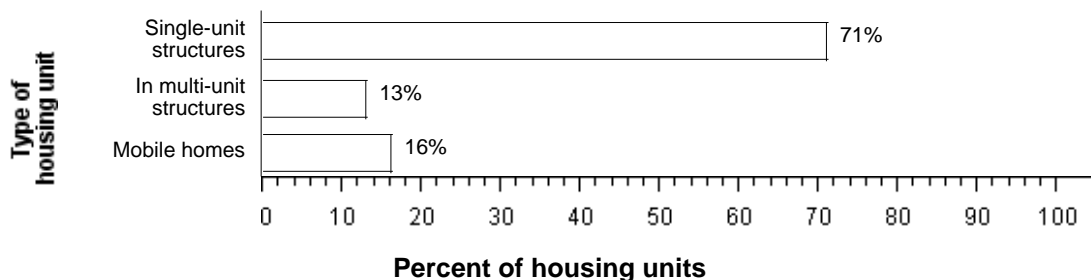

For people reporting one race alone, 61 percent was White; 38 percent was Black or African American; less than 0.5 percent was American Indian and Alaska Native; 1 percent was Asian; less than 0.5 percent was Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and 1 percent was Some other race. One percent reported Two or more races. Two percent of the people in Mississippi was Hispanic. Fifty-nine percent of the people in Mississippi was White non-Hispanic. People of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

**HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS:** In 2006, Mississippi had a total of 1.2 million housing units, 13 percent of which were vacant. Of the total housing units, 71 percent was in single-unit structures, 13 percent was in multi-unit structures, and 16 percent was mobile homes. Thirty-one percent of the housing units were built since 1990.

### The Types of Housing Units in Mississippi in 2006

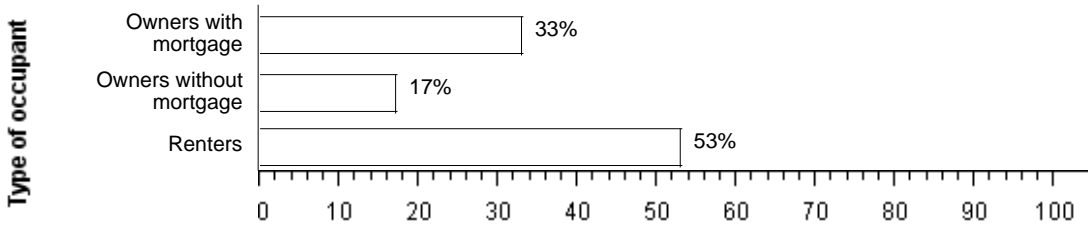

**OCCUPIED HOUSING UNIT CHARACTERISTICS:** In 2006, Mississippi had 1.1 million occupied housing units - 760,000 (71 percent) owner occupied and 315,000 (29 percent) renter occupied. Twelve percent of the households did not have telephone service and 7 percent of the households did not have access to a car, truck, or van for private use. Multi Vehicle households were not rare. Thirty-seven percent had two vehicles and another 22 percent had three or more.

**HOUSING COSTS:** The median monthly housing costs for mortgaged owners was \$940, nonmortgaged owners \$315, and renters \$584. Thirty-three percent of owners with mortgages, 17 percent of owners without mortgages, and 53 percent of renters in Mississippi spent 30 percent or more of household income on housing.
