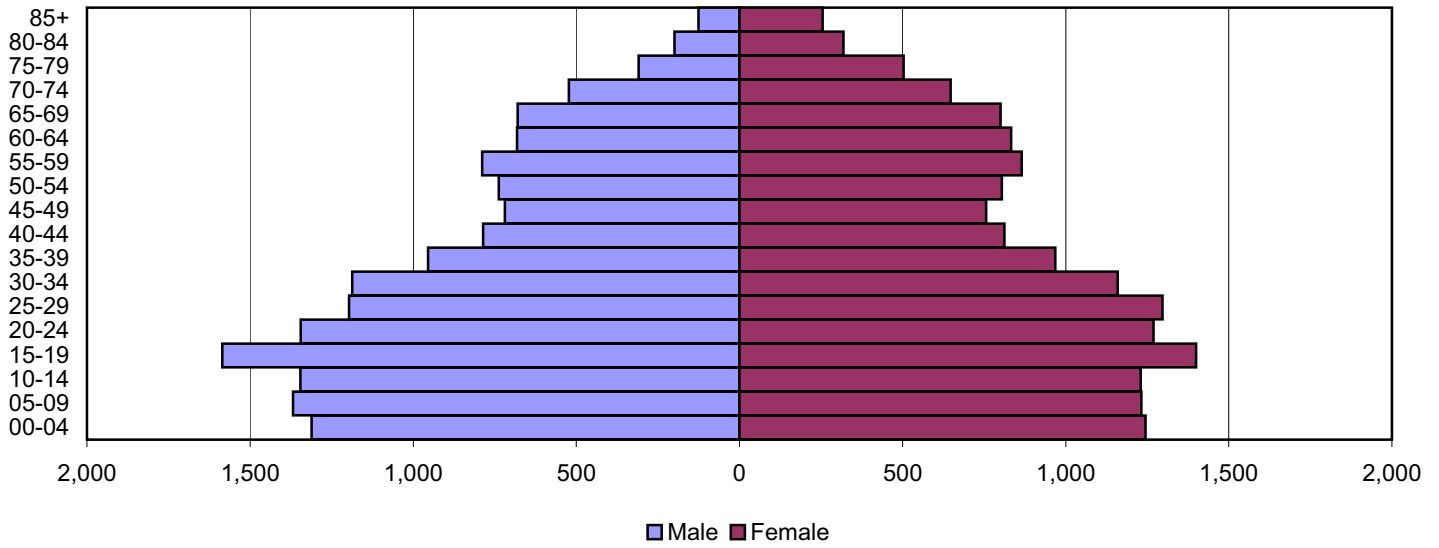

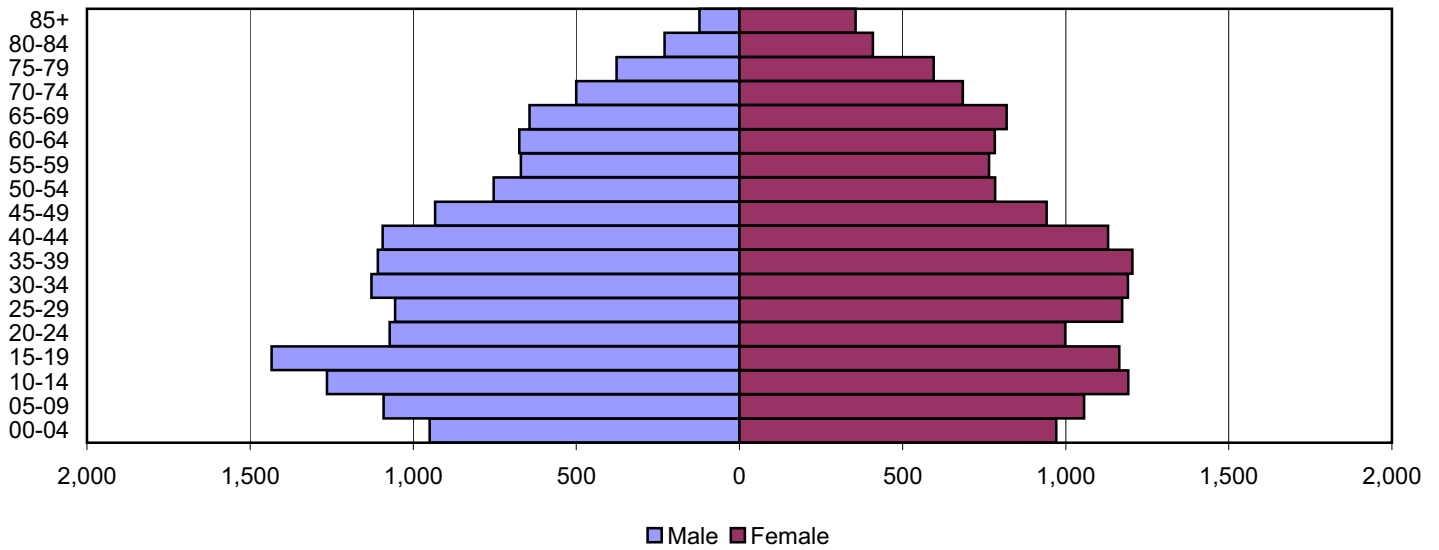

Muhlenberg County Population Pyramids

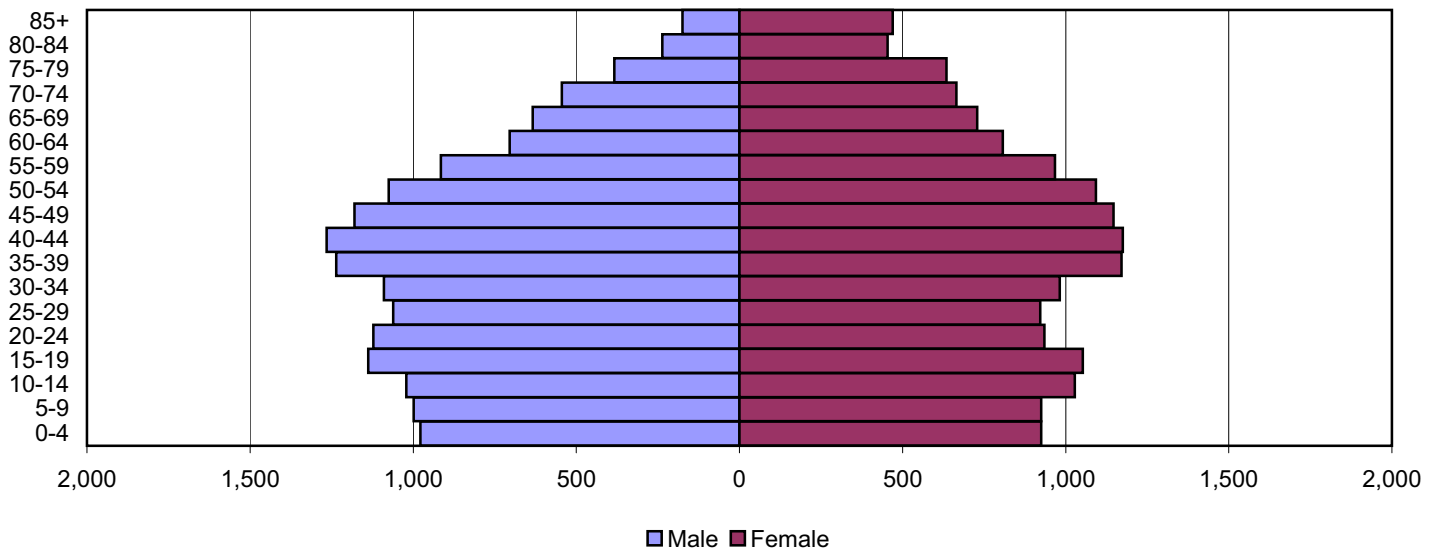

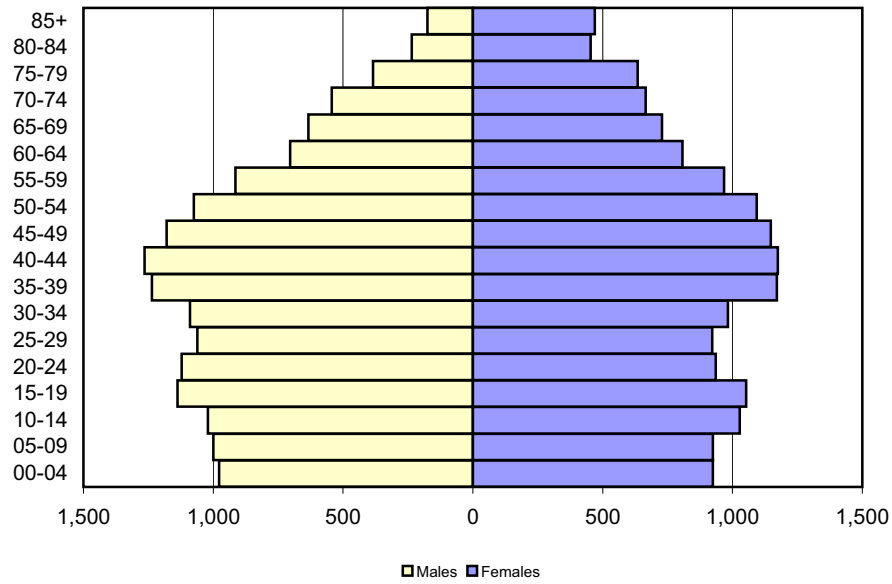

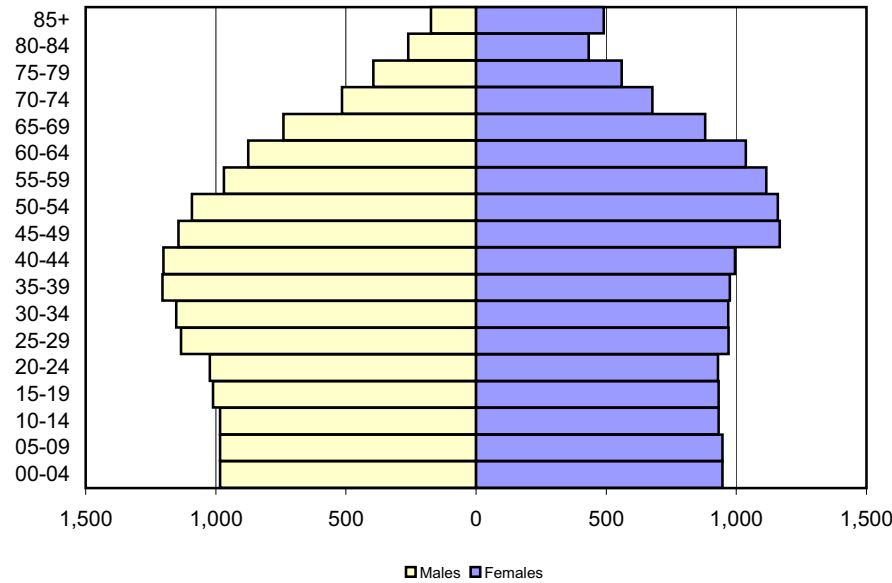

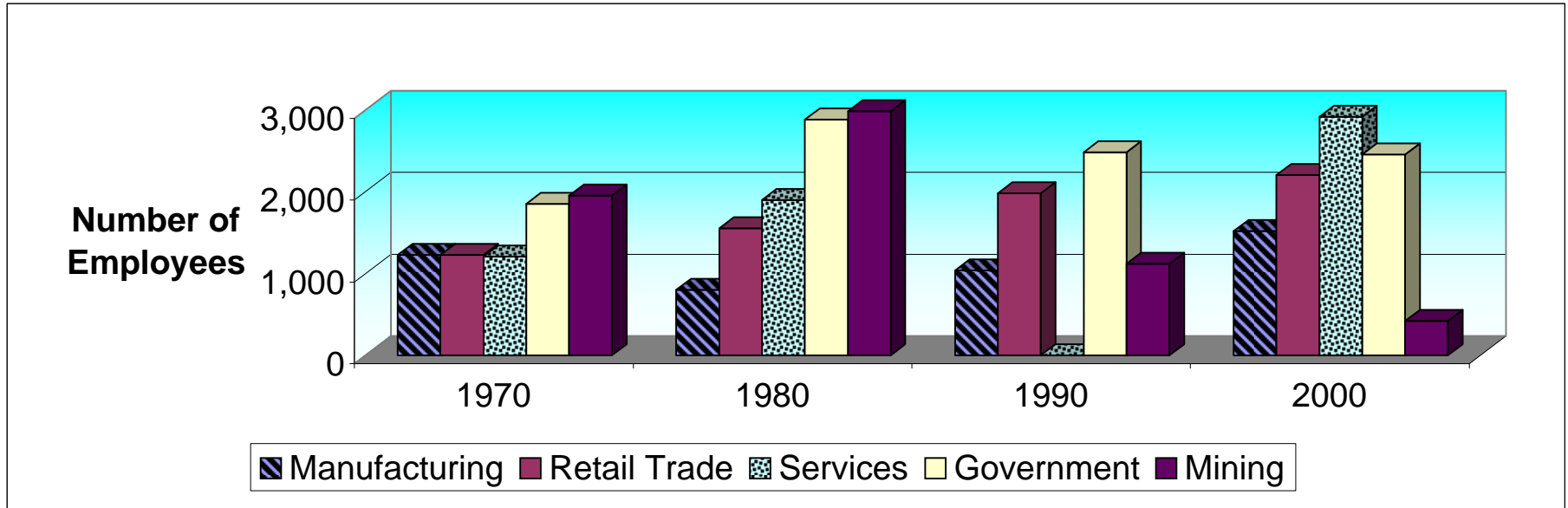
