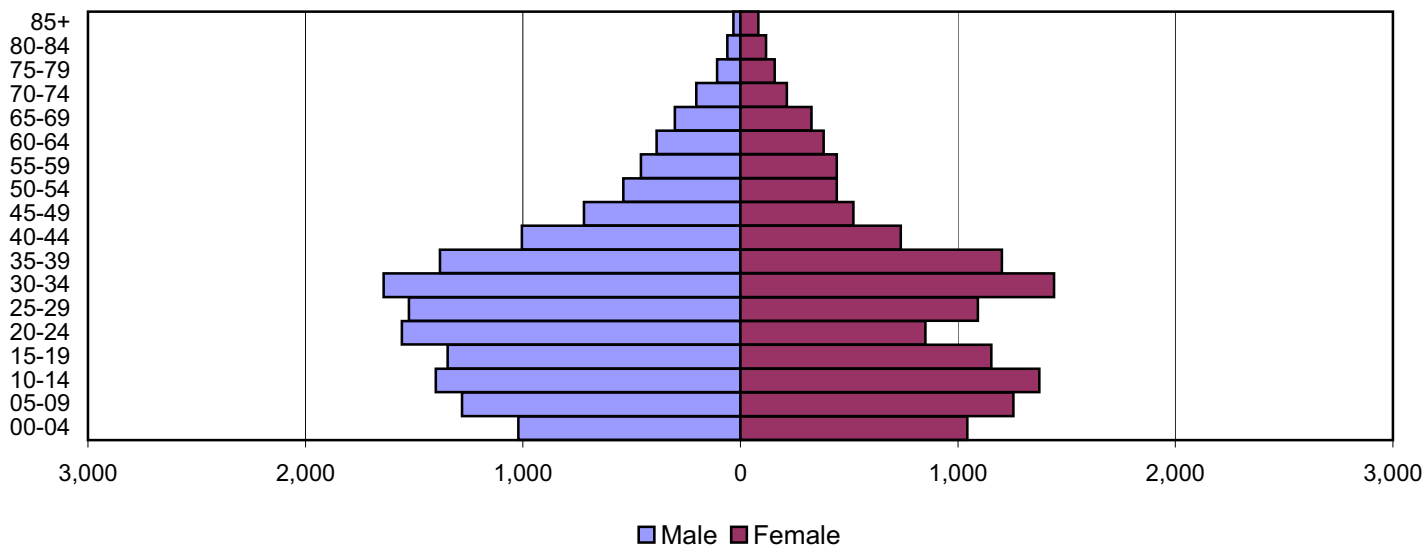

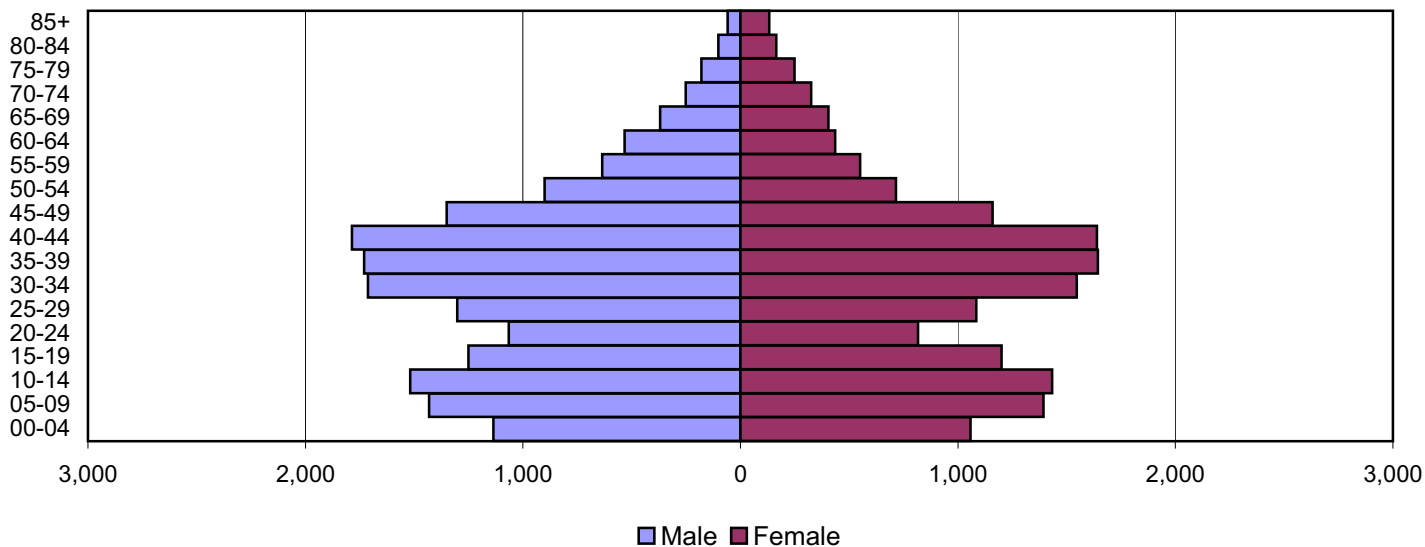
- (1) The United States is experiencing a major demographic revolution.**

### Oldham County Population Pyramids

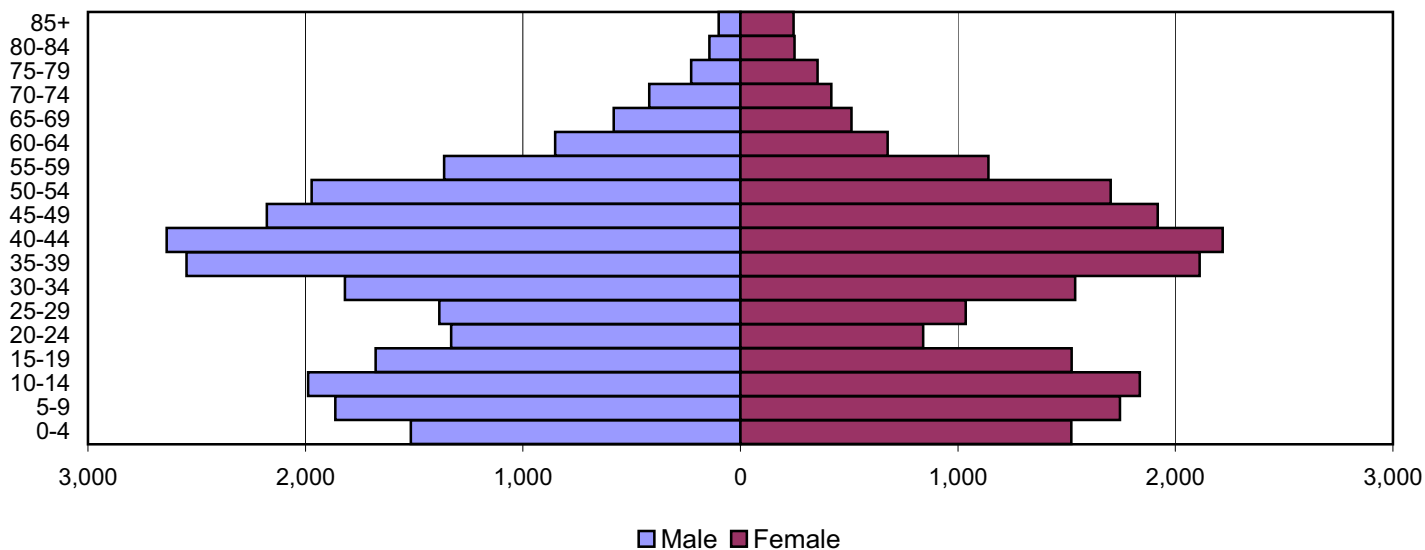

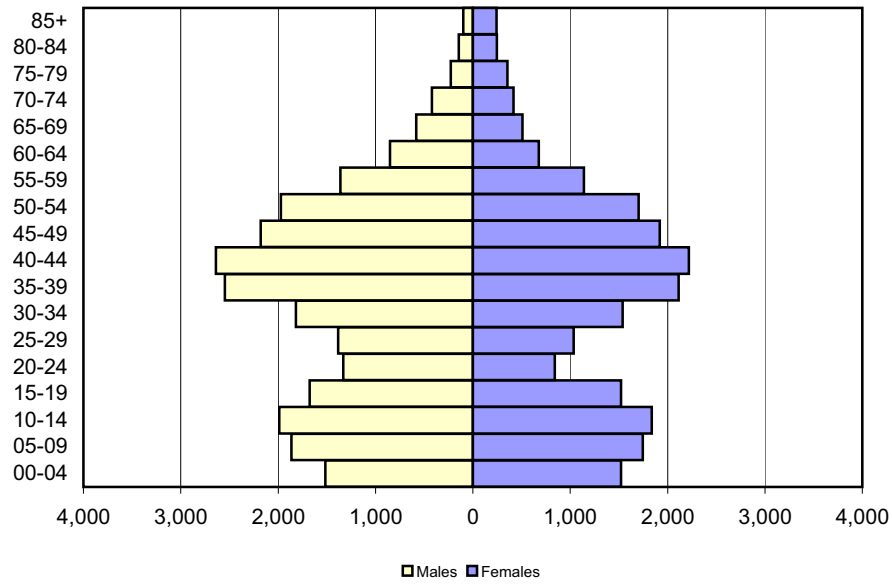

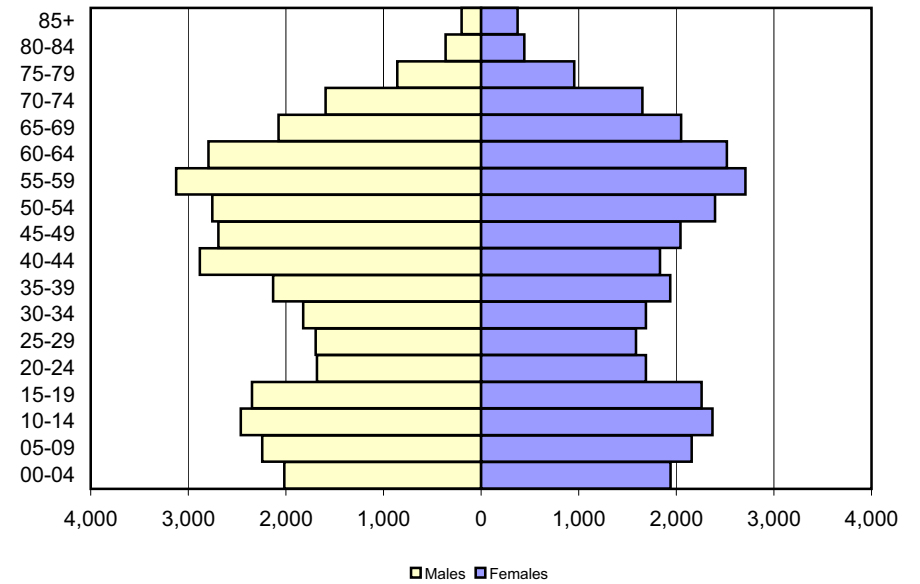

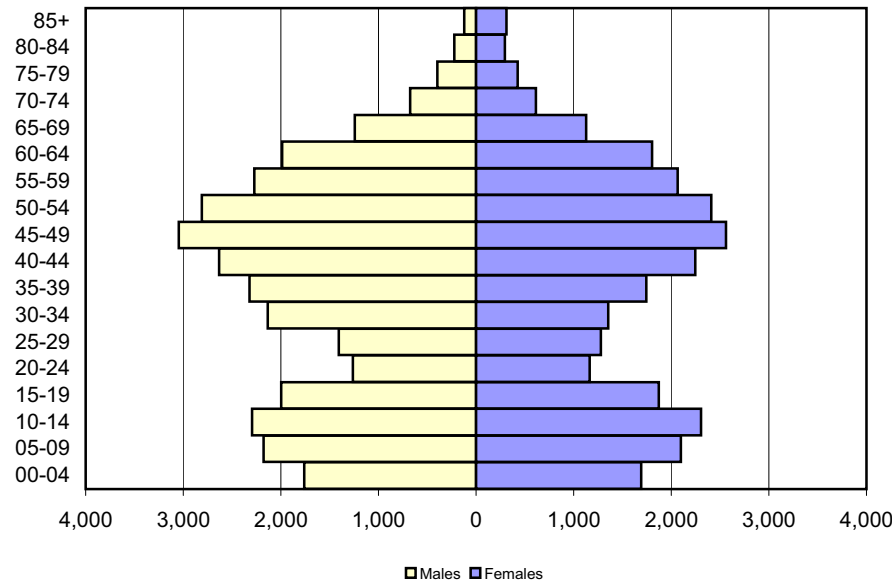

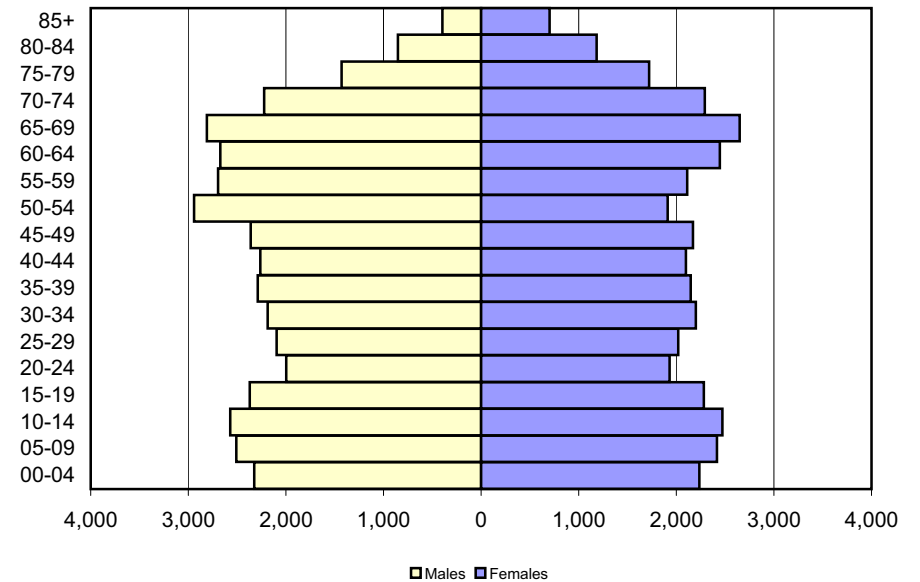

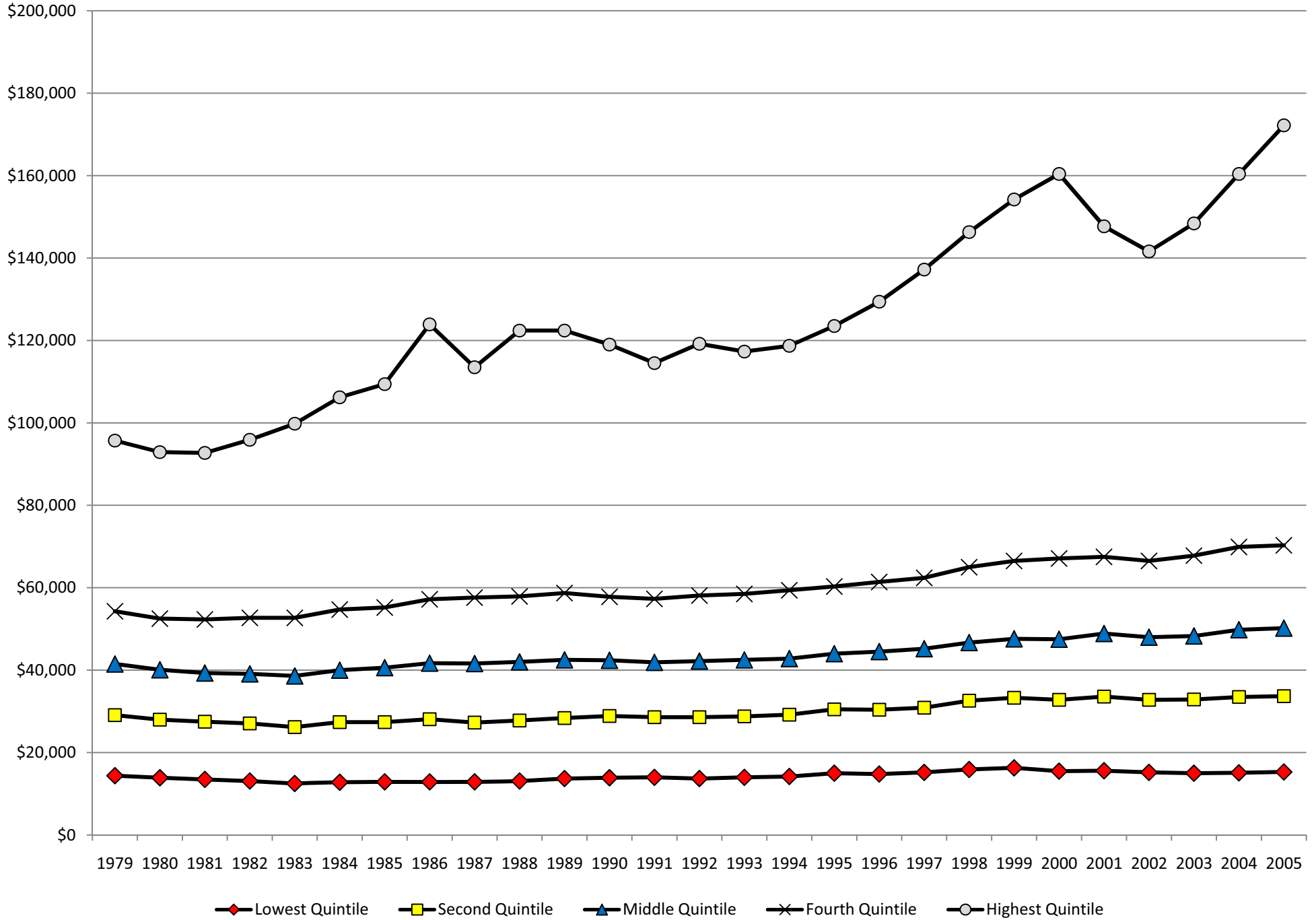

## Annual Dollar and Percentage Change in Average U.S. After-Tax Household Income by Quintile and Percentile (2005 Dollars) 1979 - 2005

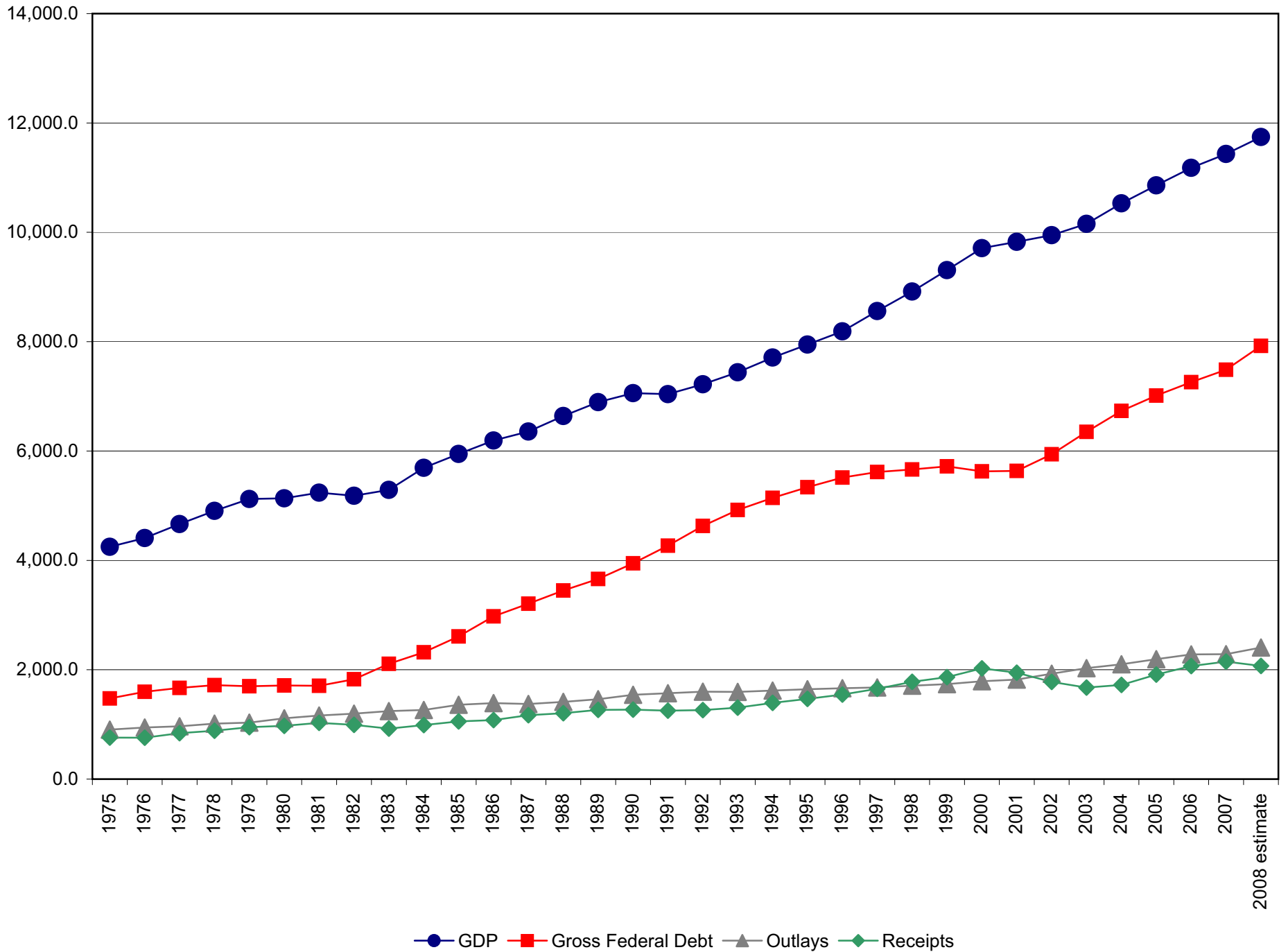

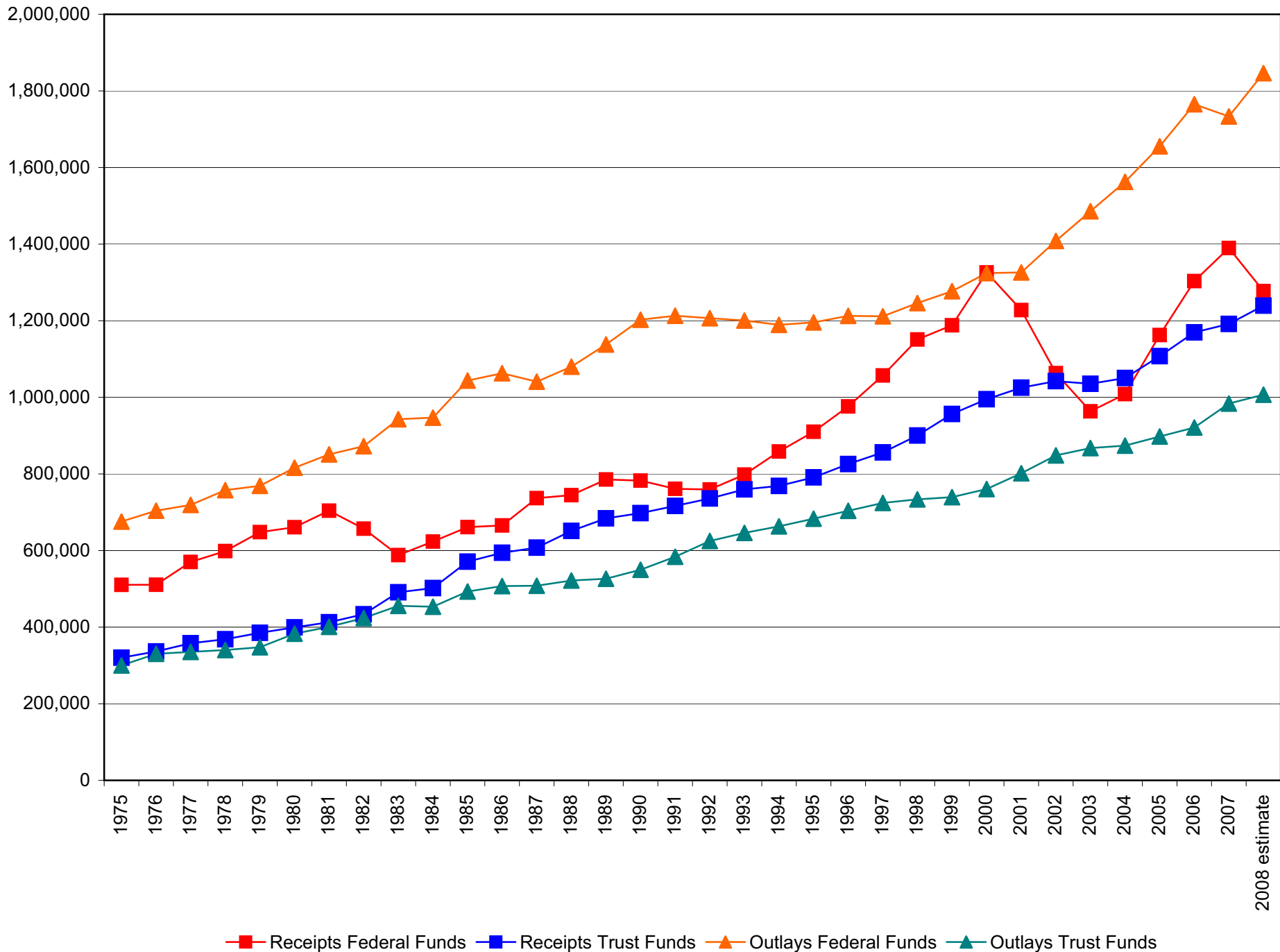
# GDP, Debt, Outlays and Receipts 1975-2008
