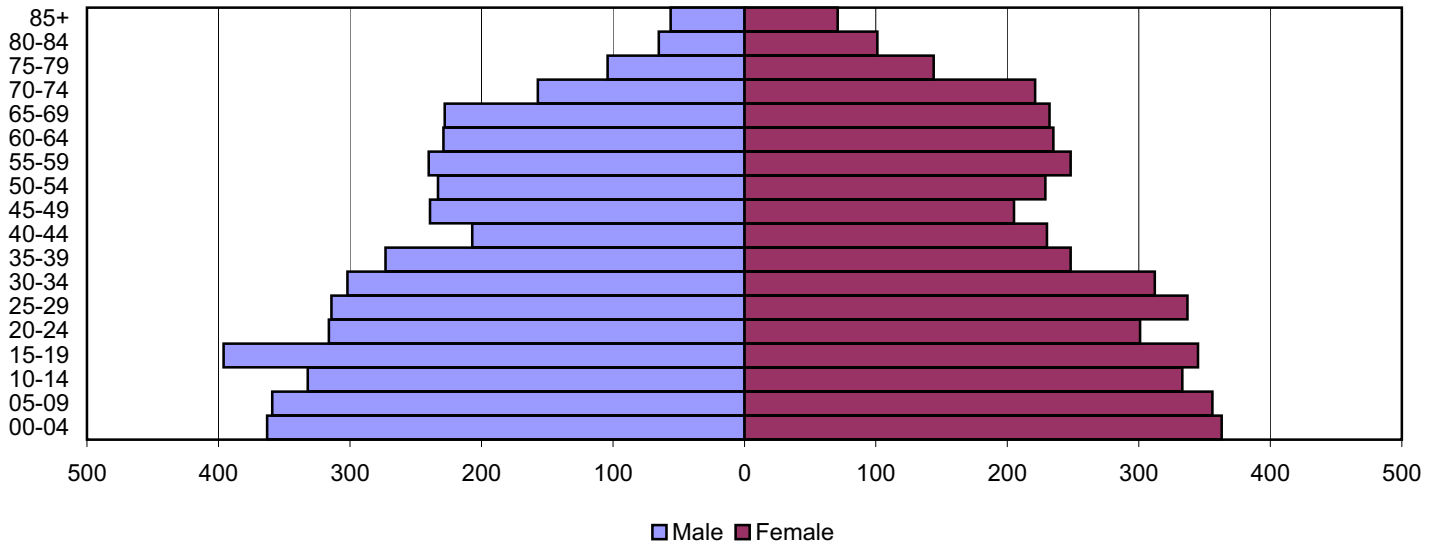

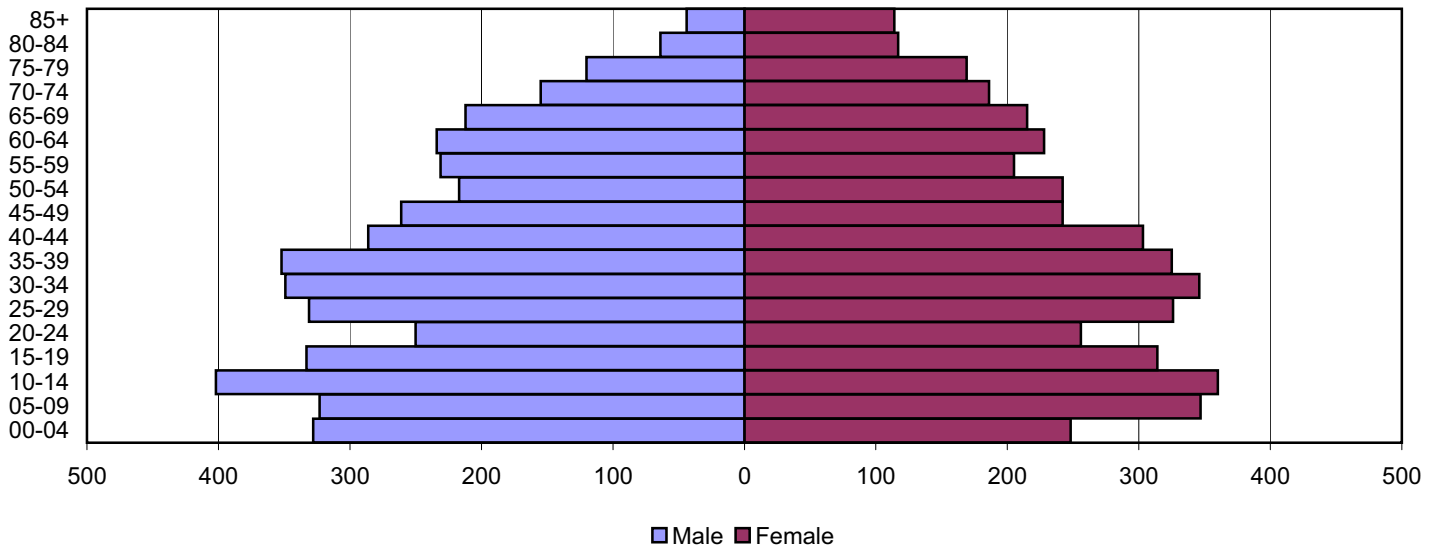

Owen County Population Pyramids

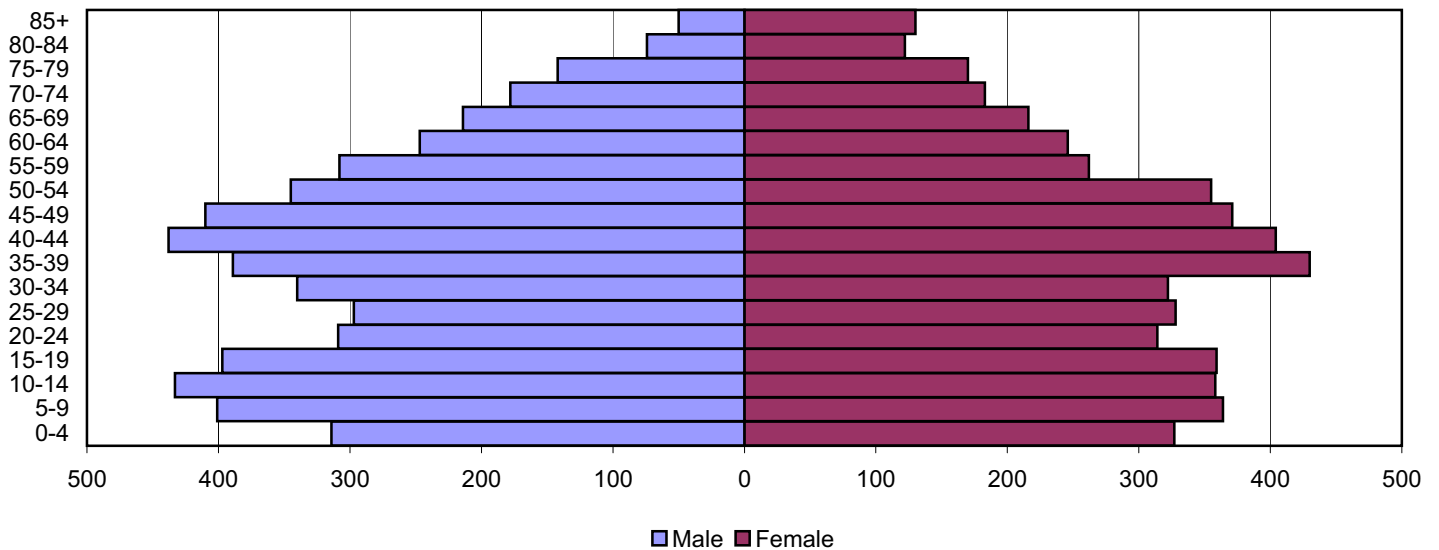

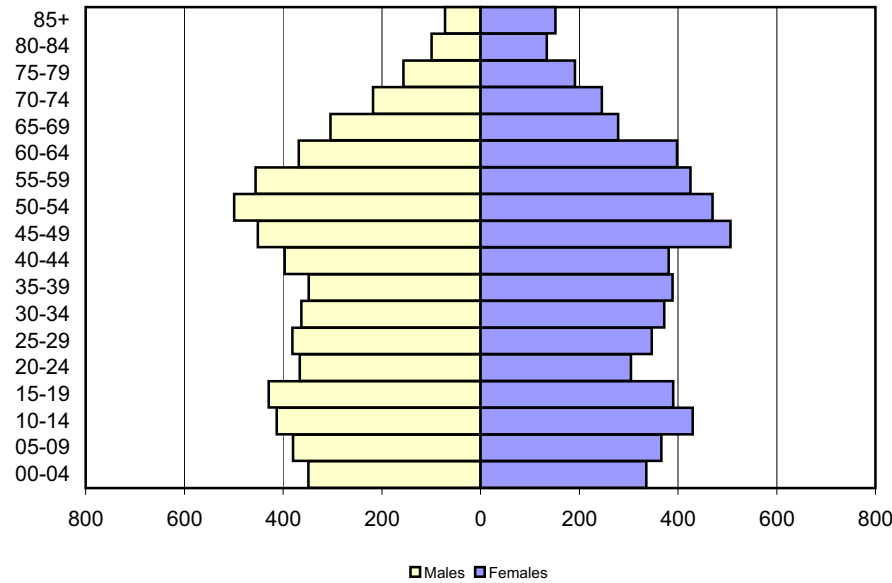
