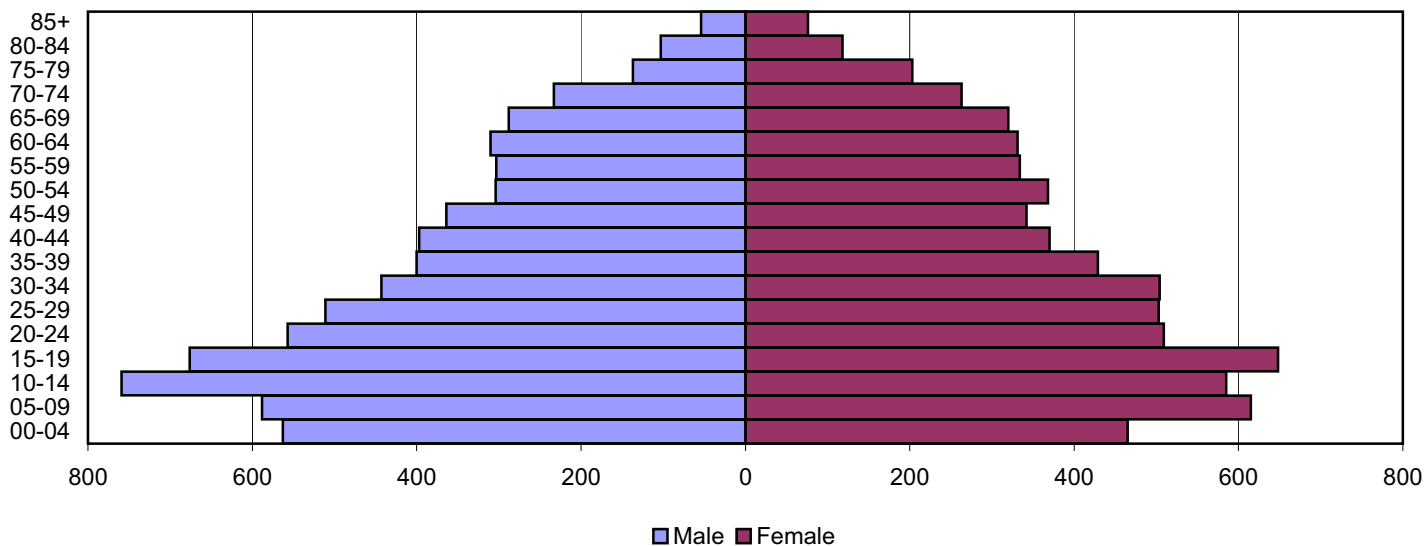

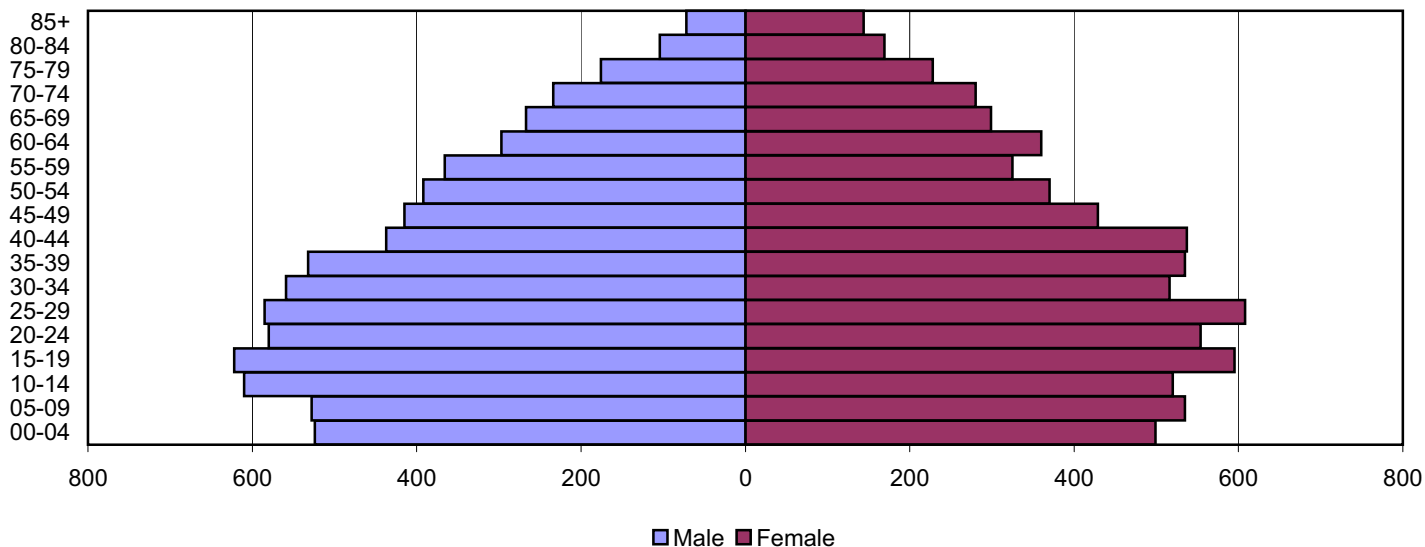

Rockcastle County Population Pyramids

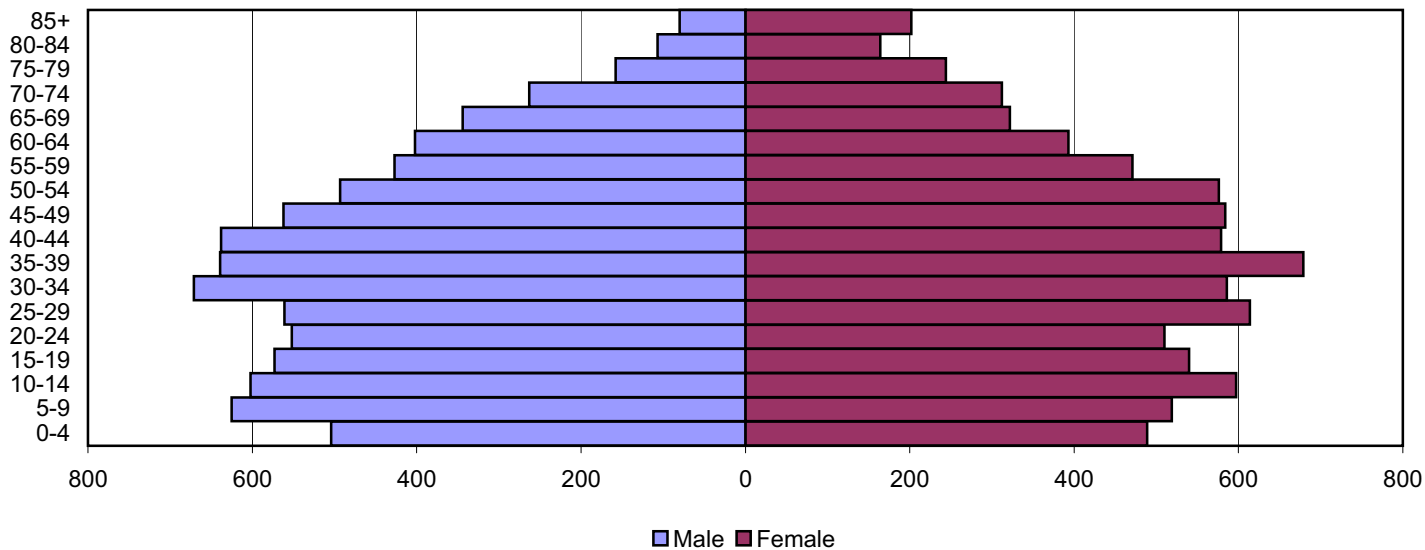

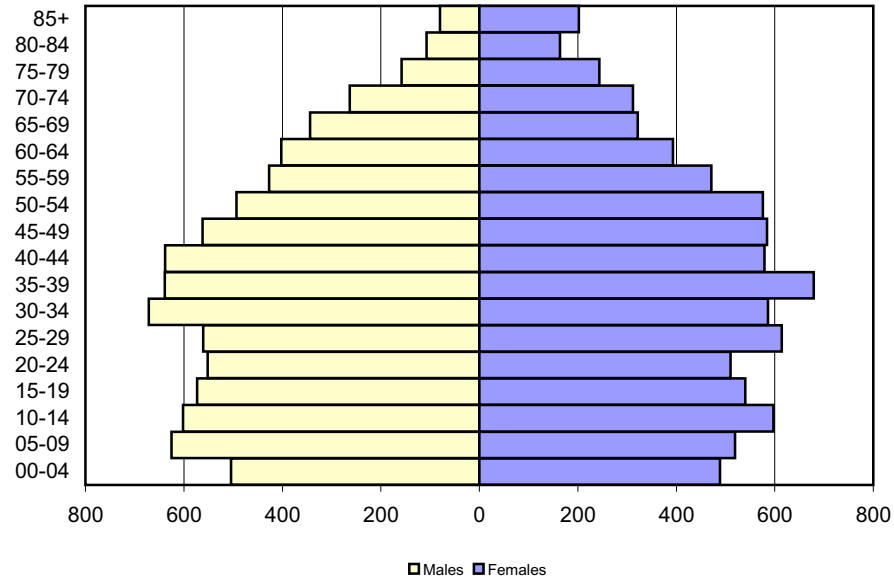

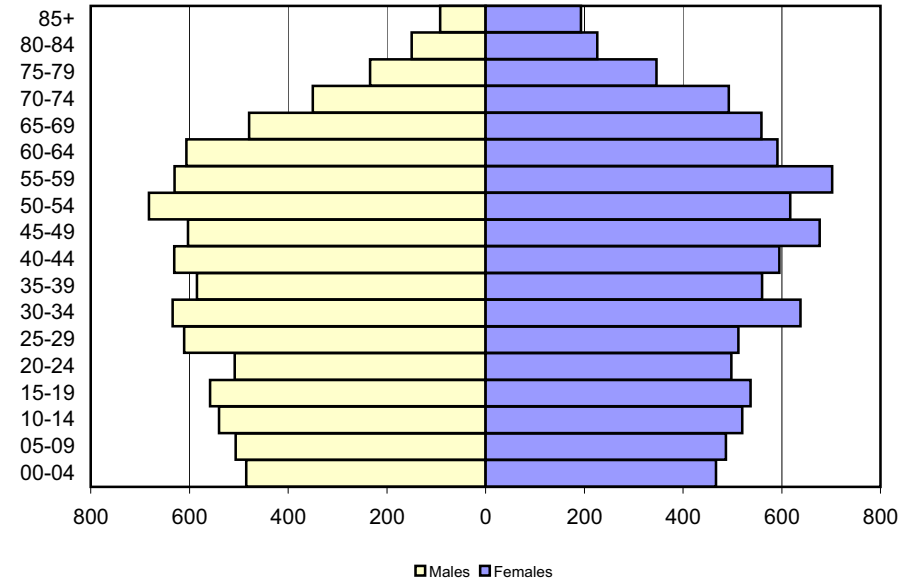

Rockcastle County Population Pyramids

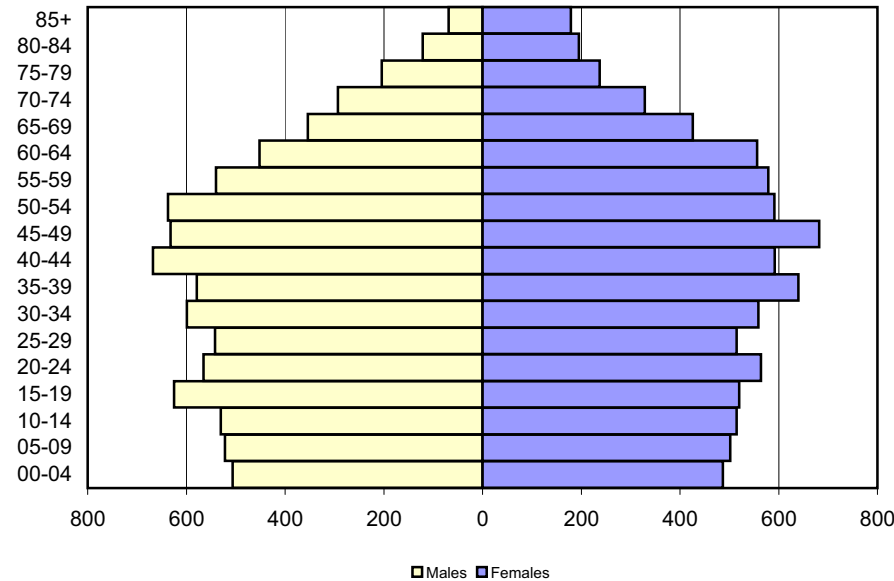

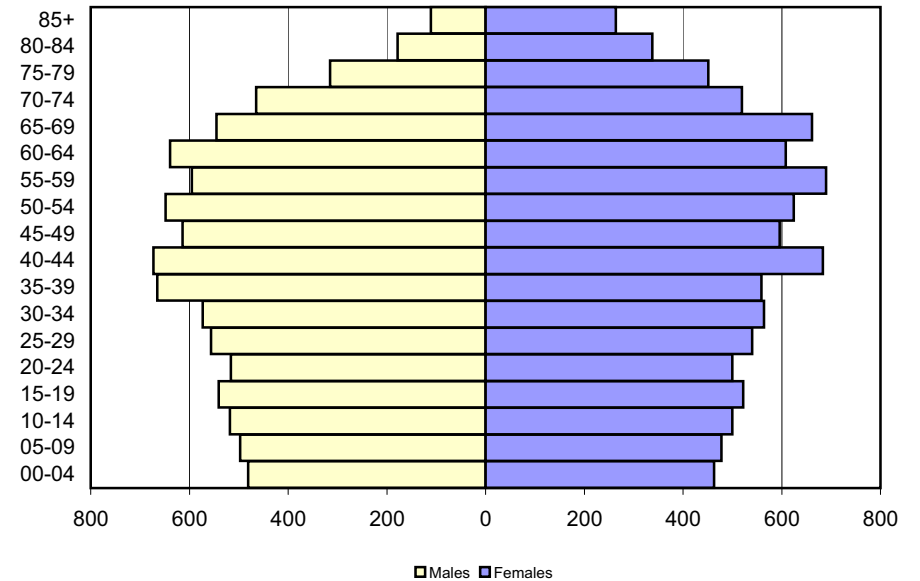

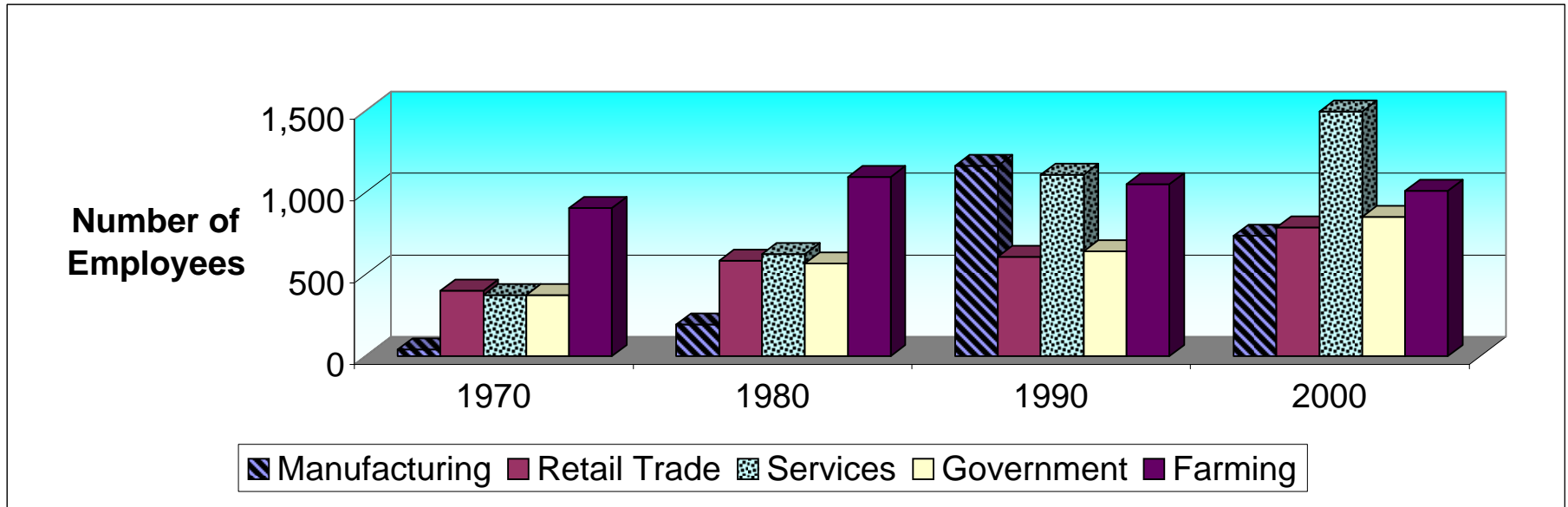
