

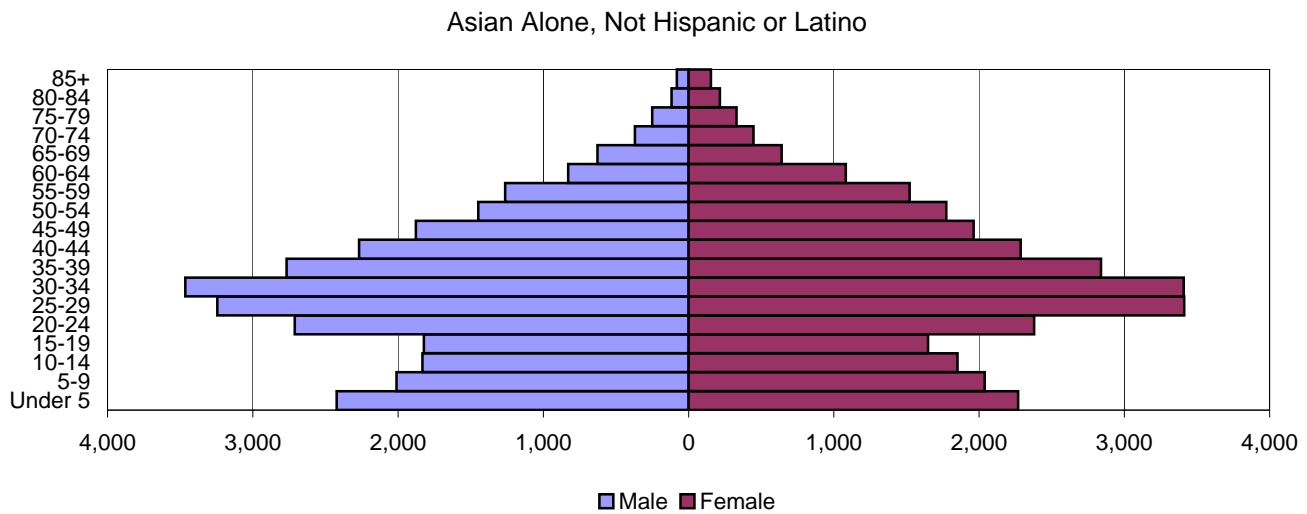
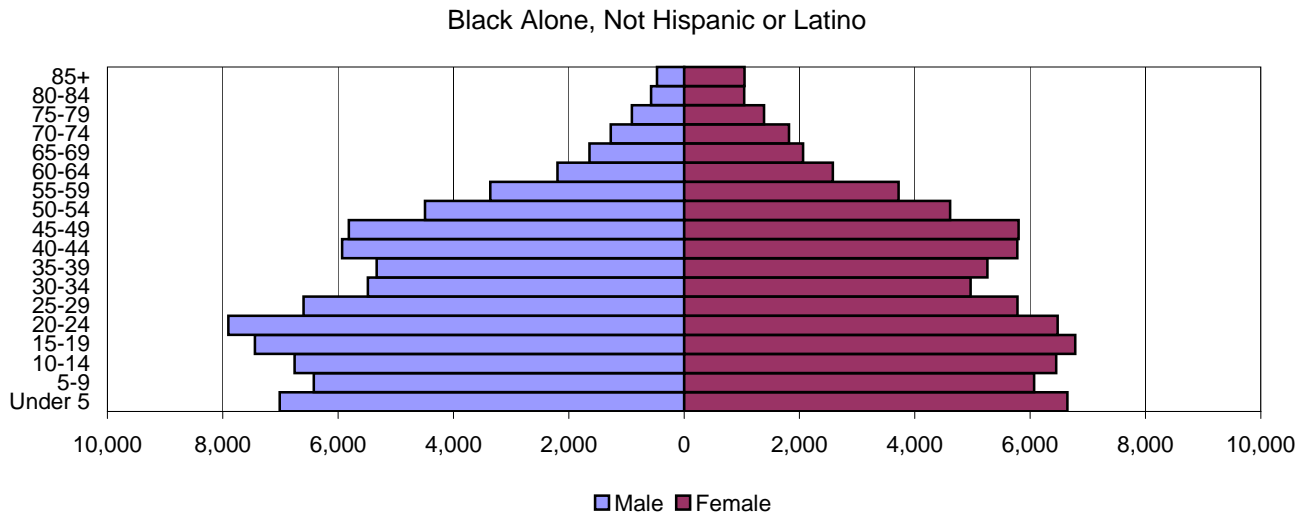
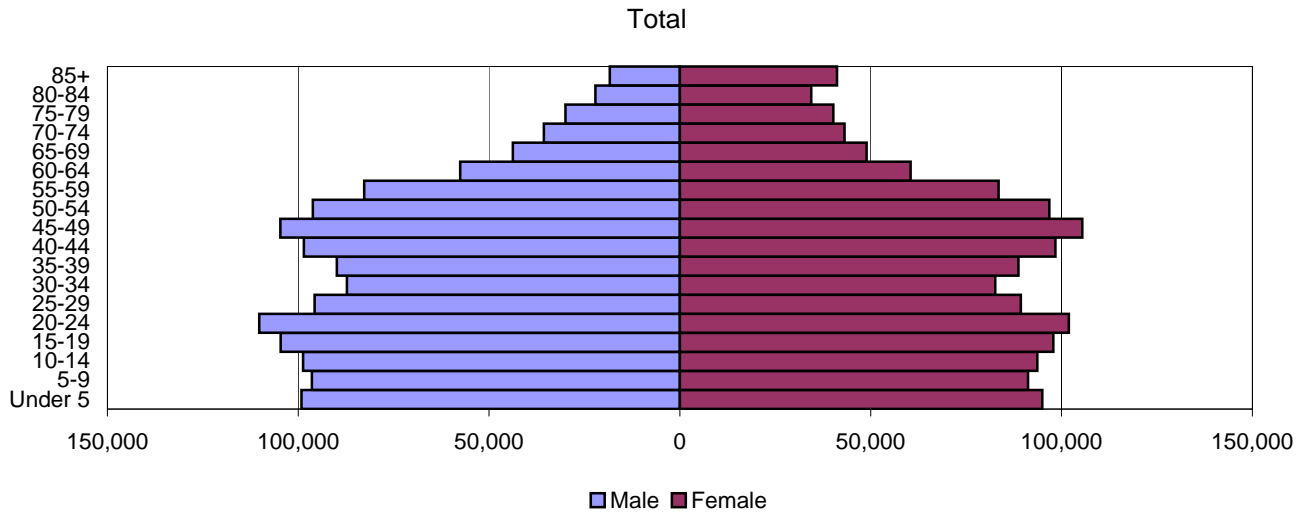
# **United States and Kansas Demographic, Social, Workforce and Educational Trends**

- (10) We have a “sick care” system masquerading as a “health care” system.**

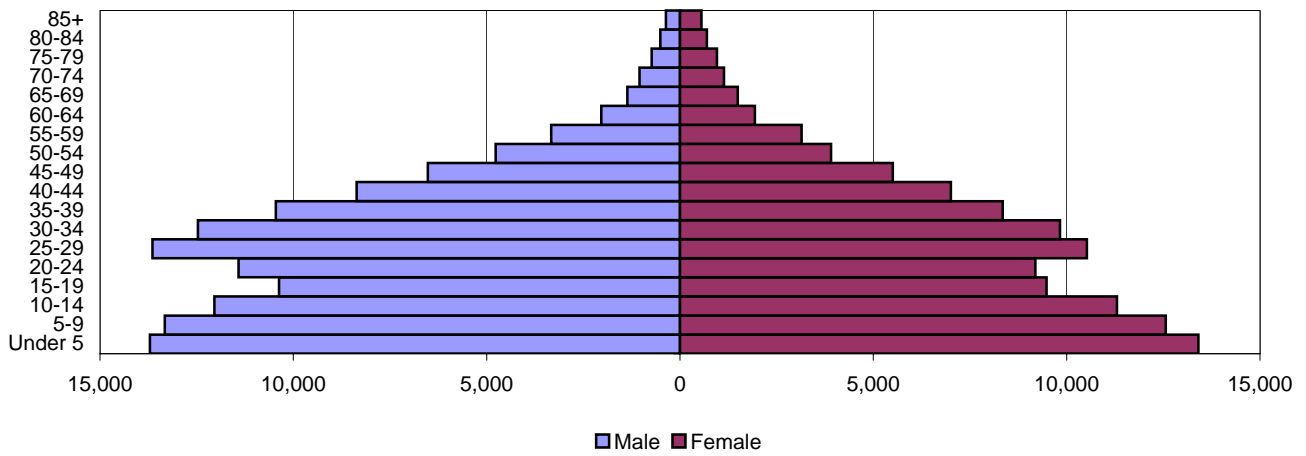
Kansas 2006 Population Pyramids



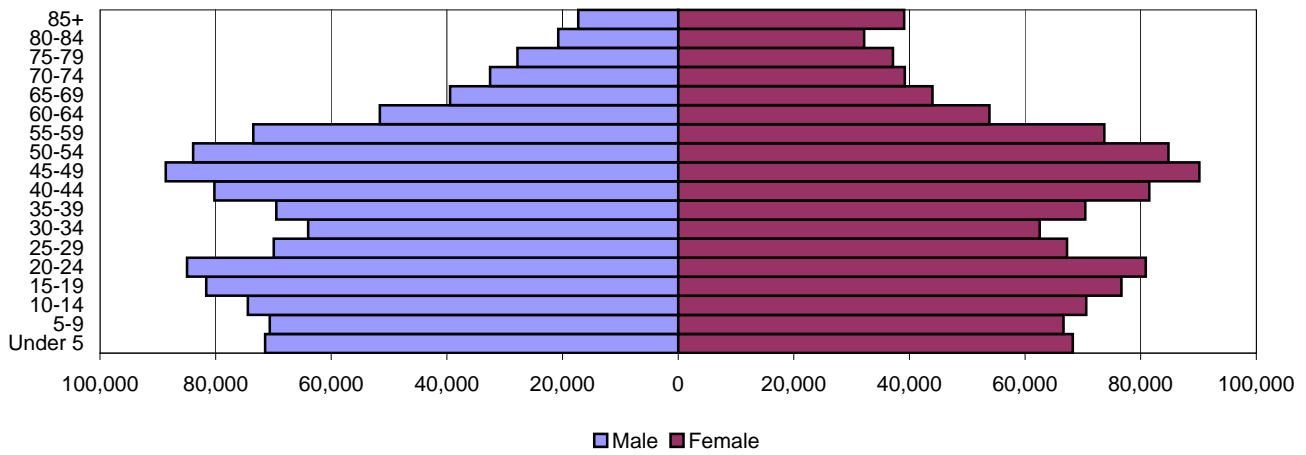

Kansas 2006 Population Pyramids

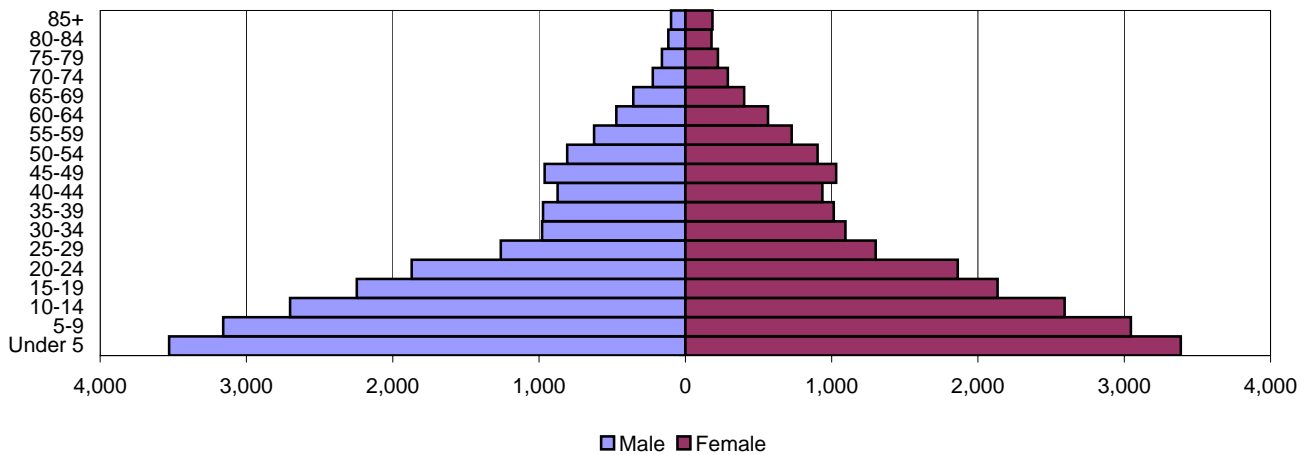
Hispanic or Latino

# Projected Percentage Change in Population 2000 to 2030

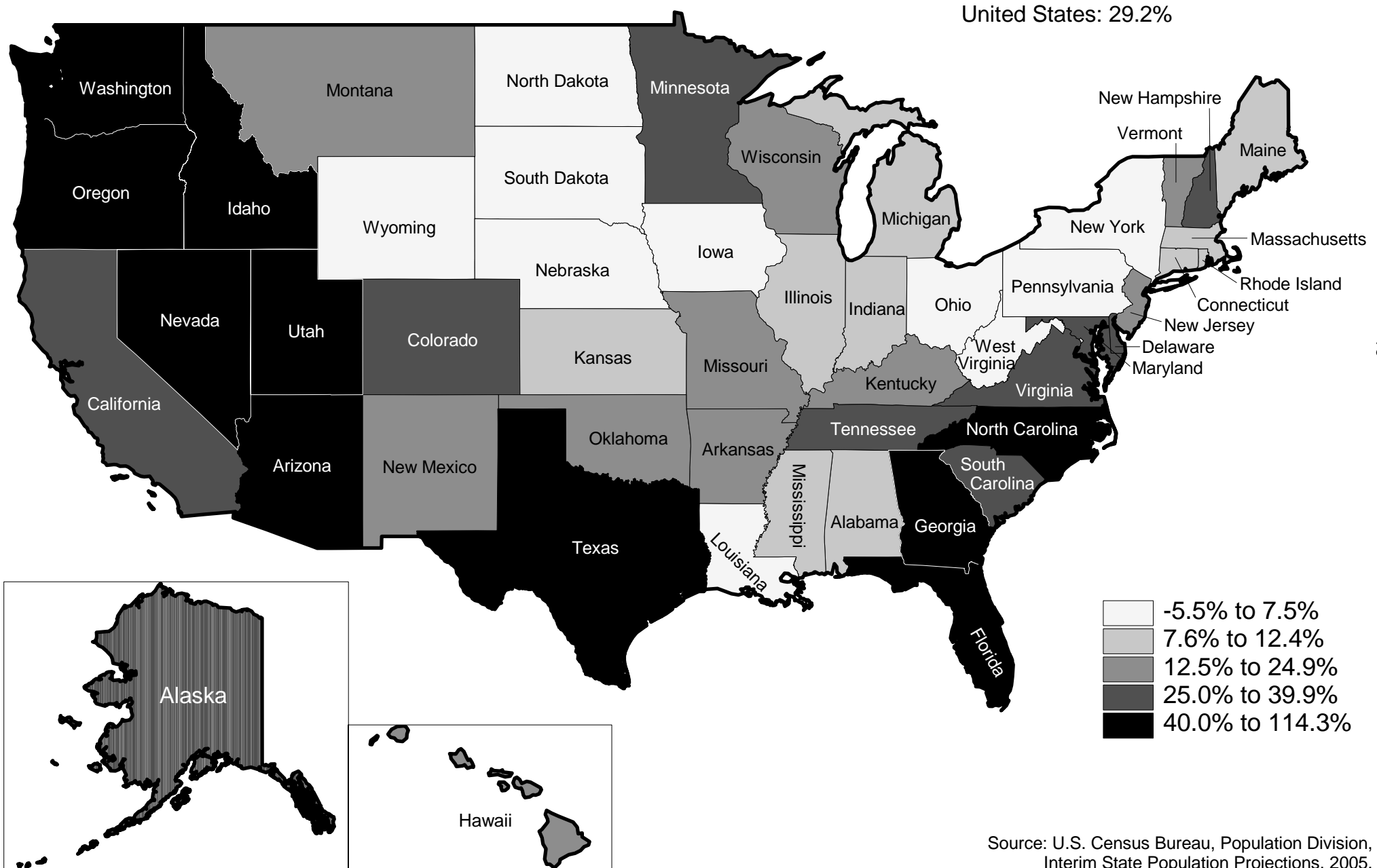

# Kansas: The State We're In

Among the key findings for the state of Kansas are:

## **1. The Achievement Gap**

- 18% of low-income 4<sup>th</sup> graders are proficient in reading, compared to 42% of non-poor students. Kansas ranks 26<sup>th</sup> in the nation on this measure.
- 14% of African-American 4<sup>th</sup> graders are proficient in reading, compared to 37% of white students. Kansas ranks 14<sup>th</sup> out of 42 states that had data available on this measure.
- 19% of Latino 4<sup>th</sup> graders are proficient in reading, compared to 37% of white students. Kansas ranks 10<sup>th</sup> out of 36 states with data available on this measure.

## **2. Early Childhood Education**

- 13% of 3-year-olds participate in state-sponsored pre-kindergarten or the federal Head Start program. Kansas ranks 27<sup>th</sup> in the nation on this measure.
- 33% of 4-year-olds participate in such programs. Kansas ranks 18<sup>th</sup> in the nation on this measure.

## **3. The High-School-to-College Pipeline**

- The state's high-school graduation rate is 78%. Kansas ranks 10<sup>th</sup> in the nation on this measure.
- 31% of high-school graduates are academically ready for college. Kansas ranks 38<sup>th</sup> in the nation on this measure.
- 68% of high-school graduates enroll in college the fall after they graduate. Kansas ranks 3<sup>rd</sup> in the nation on this measure.
- 50% of college freshmen earn a bachelor's degree within 6 years. Kansas ranks 29<sup>th</sup> in the nation on this measure.

## **4. Accessibility of Higher Education**

- 19% of the average family income is required to pay for annual community college expenses after accounting for financial aid. Kansas ranks 7<sup>th</sup> in the nation on this measure.
- 23% of the average family income is required to pay for annual expenses at a 4-year public university, after accounting for financial aid. Kansas ranks 6<sup>th</sup> in the nation on this measure.

- 100% of Kansas's grants to college students are need-based. Kansas ranks 1<sup>st</sup> among the 48 states and the District of Columbia for which data are available on this measure.

## **5. Participation in After-School Programs**

- 35% of youth go unsupervised after school. Kansas ranks 49<sup>th</sup> in the nation on this measure.
- 9% participate in after-school programs. Kansas ranks 37<sup>th</sup> in the nation on this measure.

## **6. Standards and Student Performance Measurements**

- Among 4<sup>th</sup> graders, 69% of students are proficient on the state reading test, while 33% are proficient on the National Assessment of Educational Progress. With a 36-point gap, Kansas ranks 22<sup>nd</sup> in the nation on the disparity between state and national performance measures for 4<sup>th</sup> grade reading.
- In math, 74% of 4<sup>th</sup> graders achieve proficiency on the state math test, compared to 41% who do so on the NAEP. With a 33-point gap, Kansas ranks 20<sup>th</sup> in the nation on this measure.
- Among 8<sup>th</sup> graders, 71% of students are proficient on the state reading test, while 35% achieve proficiency on the NAEP. With a 36-point gap, Kansas ranks 28<sup>th</sup> out of 47 states with data available on this measure.
- In math, 60% of 8<sup>th</sup> graders achieve proficiency on the state math test, compared to 34% who do so on the NAEP. With a 26-point gap, Kansas ranks 25<sup>th</sup> out of 47 states with data available.

## **7. Teachers' Subject-Matter Qualifications**

- 20% of middle- and high-school classes in core academic subjects are taught by instructors who lack at least a college minor in their subject. Kansas ranks 16<sup>th</sup> in the nation on this measure.
- 21% of middle- and high-school classes in core academic subjects in high-poverty schools are led by teachers without at least a college minor in their subject. Kansas ranks 5<sup>th</sup> of the 37 states with data available on this measure.
